Anointing, please call the office.

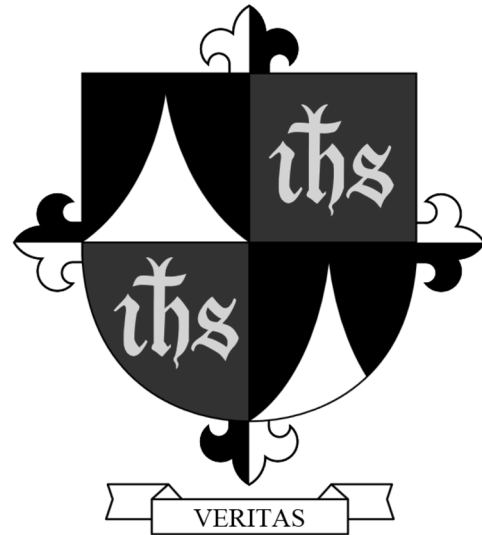

### **Update on Jubilee USA debt relief campaign and July 12th benefit for Jubilee USA, an evening with comedian Josh Kornbluth**

Poor countries spend five times as much money paying off old debt (much of it illegitimate) as they receive in official aid. Jubilee USA has successfully worked for debt relief for the poorest countries, and is a leader in continuing efforts to build a non-partisan faith-based coalition to increase transparency and fairness in global lending. Debt relief funds have been used to build schools, cancel fees at rural health clinics and provide access to clean water.

Recently the U.S. Supreme Court announced it would not hear Argentina's appeal of a lower court ruling in favor of a group of hedge funds suing the country for more than \$1 billion. In 2001, Argentina defaulted on its international debt. Nearly 93% of its creditors accepted debt restructuring for less money than they were owed. A small group of creditors held out. Some debt from the hold outs was purchased by hedge funds that have been called "vulture funds" due to the funds' strategy of buying up the debt of economically distressed countries for pennies on the dollar and then suing for full payment. These predatory "vulture funds" attempt to seize debt relief money by suing countries that are receiving relief through established international debt relief processes.

# Faith & Spirituality

An excerpt from  
"Evangelii Gaudium"  
(The Joy of the Gospel)

**Apostolic Exhortation of the Holy Father  
FRANCIS**

At times our media culture and some intellectual circles convey a marked skepticism with regard to the Church's message, along with a certain cynicism. As a consequence, many pastoral workers, although they pray, develop a sort of inferiority complex which leads them to relativize or conceal their Christian identity and convictions. They end up being unhappy with who they are and what they do; they do not identify with their mission of evangelization and this weakens their commitment. They end up stifling the joy of mission with a kind of obsession about being like everyone else and possessing what everyone else possesses. Their work of evangelization thus becomes forced, and they devote little energy and very limited time to it. Pastoral workers can thus fall into a relativism which, whatever their particular style of spirituality or way of thinking, proves even more dangerous than doctrinal relativism. It has to do with the deepest and inmost decisions that shape their way of life. This practical relativism consists in acting as if God did not exist, making decisions as if the poor did not exist, setting goals as if others did not exist, working as if people who have not received the Gospel did not exist. It is striking that even some who clearly have solid doctrinal and spiritual convictions frequently fall into a lifestyle which leads to an attachment to financial security, or to a desire for power or human glory at all cost, rather than giving their lives to others in mission.

#### **What is RCIA?**

R.C.I.A, the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a journey of inquiry, instruction, prayer and discernment, for those who seek a relationship with Jesus Christ, and who are considering doing so through the Catholic Church. RCIA prepares men and women to receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation), but is essentially the beginning of a new life in Christ. RCIA begins with a series of inquiry meetings which provide an opportunity for participants to ask questions in a welcoming and safe environment, and to begin, or continue, to explore the Catholic faith.

#### **Who Might Consider RCIA?**

Wherever you are on your journey with Christ, we welcome you! Participants include adults who...

- Have questions about the Catholic faith and an interest in learning more about the faith
- Are not Baptized and interested in preparing to enter into a life in Christ through His Church and the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation).
- Have been Baptized in another Christian tradition and seek to continue their journey in Christ through the Catholic Church.
- Are Baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and who seek a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ...
  - By learning more about their Catholic faith
  - Through full initiation in the life of the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation.
