

Pastor's Corner

In the month of November, we remember those who have gone before us. I find it a bittersweet time. I am an "orphan:" all of my blood-family are gone. I even learned, almost by accident, that my father's half-brother died in this September. Since I hadn't heard from him in almost a decade, I assumed he had died long ago! During this time, I not only remember my family and those close to me, but also the scores of people that I have ministered to in sickness and near death and those whose funeral rites I have had the privilege of celebrating over the last eighteen and a half years. And I think of them not just as sick, dying or dead, but of the blessing they were to me and/or to countless others throughout their lives, whether it was long or short.

When my mother died back in December 2001, someone gave me a prayer card that had the following prayer on it. I think it is absolutely beautiful and it has given me, and many of those I've shared it with since, profound consolation when confronted with the reality of death, and the more powerful reality of God. I hope you find it as powerful as I do.

We seem to give them back to You, O God,
who gave them first to us.
Yet as You did not lose them in giving,
so do we not lose them by their return.
Not as the world gives, do you give, O Lover of souls.
What You give, You take not away,
for what is Yours is ours also if we are Yours.

And life is eternal
and love is immortal,
and death is only a horizon,
and a horizon is nothing,
save the limit of our sight.

Lift us up, strong Son of God, that we may see further; cleanse our eyes that we may see more clearly; draw us closer to Yourself that we may know ourselves to be nearer to our loved ones who are with You. And while You prepare a place for us, prepare us also for that happy place, that where You are we may be also for evermore.

Pope Francis has said, "Politics is one of the highest forms of love, because it is in the service of the common good."

A coalition of national Catholic organizations has put together a 2016 Election Pope Francis Voter Guide, titled "A Revolution of Tenderness." (Find it at https://popefrancis16.com.)

Meanwhile, at home, the California Catholic Conference of Bishops has examined the 17 statewide ballot propositions, and offers reflections from Catholic teaching on each one (see www.cacatholic.org). The CAC has singled out three propositions as being especially important for Catholics. It urges us to

> **support** Proposition 57 (to reform the criminal justice system) and Proposition 62 (to end the death penalty) oppose Proposition 66 (which would reduce the safeguards against executing an innocent person).
