







## Pastor's Corner

This 'n that

First of all, thank you. Last weekend was Rosary Sunday. It is the one opportunity we Dominicans have to ask you, the people we serve, for your financial support of future priests and brothers. It usually takes a couple of weeks for the Province to tabulate and send out the initial results of the appeal, but when I do get them, I will be sure to put them in the bulletin. Although we get to ask only once, the appeal remains open for months. It is not too late to make a gift. Two weeks ago, I spent two and half days down in Los Angeles at the fourth and final meeting of Parish Catalyst's first learning cohort on ministry to millennials. (Parish Catalyst's founder, Bill Simon, just published a book: *Great Catholic Parishes: How Four Essential Practices Make Them Great* if you're looking for something good to read!) I was invited to participate when I was still at my previous assignment at St. Catherine of Siena Newman Center. It was a series of four three-day sessions over two years. We were inspired and challenged to welcome and include millennials in our ministries. The new chair of the Parish Pastoral Council, Katie Strausser, is a member of that generation. I attended the last three with our principal, Ken Willers; we were joined once by David Flores and once by Scott Mixer. The last time was just Ken and I; it was an exciting time for the two of us to work closely together and cement our commitment to be "Better Together!"

Last week, I was at a three-day meeting over at San Damiano Retreat Center in Danville with other Western Dominicans who serve in the 10 parishes we staff. Six student brothers and the Provincial joined us for the first full day. The brothers got to hear what the work is like "on the ground" and to ask questions. The Provincial shared and we discussed the latest update on our ongoing, Province-wide strategic planning process. The next day, we had a continued facilitation process, led by Keith Borchers of Evangelium Consulting. I was finally able to get together with a classmate and celebrate our 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of vows; it was back in September. Sadly, the third member of our class in parish ministry was unable to come.

Finally, as you read this, I will be in Salt Lake City to celebrate a wedding of a former parishioner. Getting to know people all over the West is one of the benefits of our frequent moving! I confess though, it would much easier to attend these types of events if the Province was a couple of counties rather than 10 states! My main connection is the groom, but I also got to know the bride's sister and her family in my early years in Salt Lake. Fr. Cassian will have just returned from Salt Lake, visiting his BFF, a Dominican who lives there. It is a bit ironic that our two, independently scheduled visits almost overlapped, and that we both have strong Utah connections. But as you well know, these things happen.

As we approach election day, Pax Christi USA invites us to join them in the following prayer:

## A Prayer for Understanding and Integrity in the Voting Process

Help us to remember that we are casting our vote not only for ourselves, but for the billions of other beings in the world whose lives will be directly affected by our nation's election results.

May we be keenly mindful that the decisions made by the leaders we elect will affect so many:

- The afflicted children in Flint, Ramallah, Aleppo and Abuja
- The migratory monarch, the African elephant, and the pollinating bees
- The towering canopies and deep underground roots of Your ancient forests, and the birds, insects, primates, and other animals that inhabit them
- The war-weary people of Honduras, Syria, and the Philippines, struggling against violence and corruption
- The pika, the polar bear, and the darting fish of Your coral reefs, whose habitats are rapidly vanishing
- The desperate refugees fleeing violence, now languishing in prisons of our making
- The unarmed people of color gunned down in the favelas of Rio, the streets of Cleveland and Baltimore, and the shantytowns of Johannesburg; and
- All others with whom we share Your planet.

Let us cast our votes with prayerful discernment, humility, compassion, and in witness to your love for all creation.

And let us each do what we can to ensure that our Sisters and Brothers who are eligible to vote -- especially those lacking in power and access -- are encouraged and permitted to do so, absent interference, intimidation, threat, and violence.

In the name of Jesus, who cast His lot with the weak and the oppressed. Amen.




## Book Group

Endow will meet Fridays at 7:00 p.m. in Norton Hall.


This is a small study group capped at 12 women. It is open to women of all ages. No homework – the study guide is covered during the meeting.
