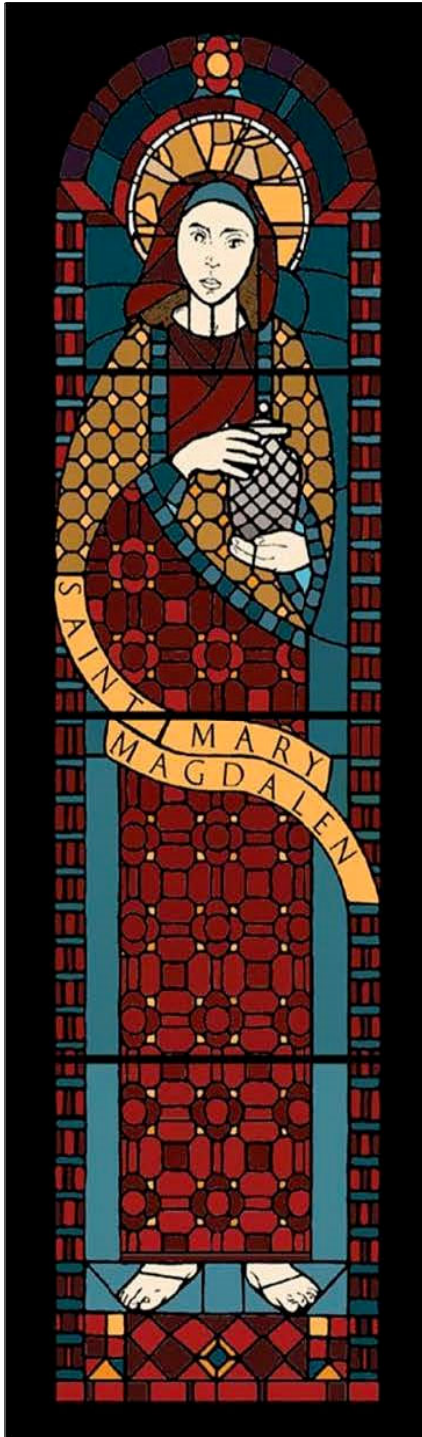

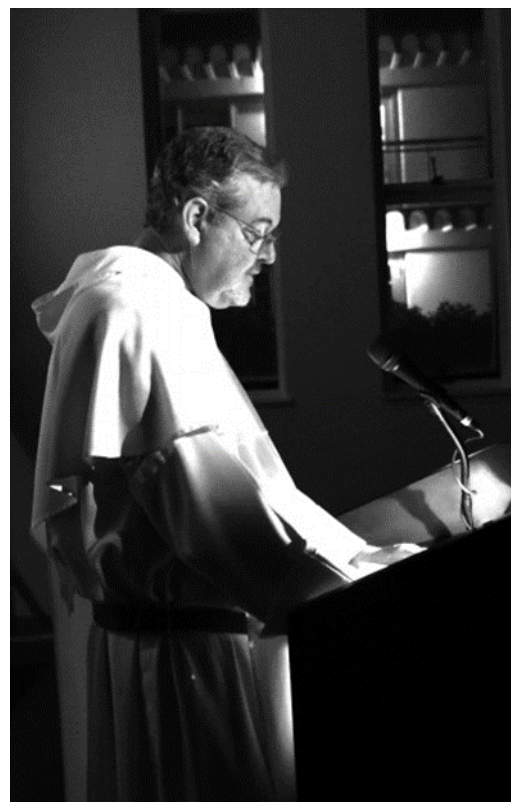

Pastor's Corner

As we observe Labor Day this weekend, I offer some thoughts about work from one of my favorite theologians, Dorothy L. Sayers. She was one of the first women to graduate from Oxford University. As she had enough money to live on from writing her famous Lord Peter Wimsey mystery stories and other fiction, she was able to do what she considered her real vocation, write works of theology and apologetics. Her essay *Why Work?*, from which I quote, was first published in 1942. –Fr. Carl, OP

"I have already, on a previous occasion, spoken at some length on the subject of Work and Vocation. What I urged then was a thoroughgoing revolution in our whole attitude to work. I asked that it should be looked upon, not as a necessary drudgery to be undergone for the purpose of making money, but as a way of life in which the nature of man should find its proper exercise and delight and so fulfill itself to the glory of God. That it should, in fact, be thought of as a creative activity undertaken for the love of the work itself; and that man, made in God's image, should make things, as God makes them, for the sake of doing well a thing that is well worth doing."

"...work is not, primarily, a thing one does to live, but the thing one lives to do. It is, or it should be, the full expression of the worker's faculties, the thing in which he finds spiritual, mental and bodily satisfaction, and the medium in which he offers himself to God...His satisfaction comes, in the godlike manner, from looking upon what he has made and finding it very good."

"...we should no longer think of work as something that we hastened to get through in order to enjoy our leisure; we should look on our leisure as the period of changed rhythm that refreshed us for the delightful purpose of getting on with our work."

"...we should fight tooth and nail, not for mere employment, but for the quality of the work that we had to do. We should clamor to be engaged in work that was worth doing, and in which we could take pride."

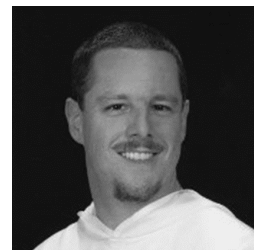
"In nothing has the Church so lost Her hold on reality as in Her failure to understand and respect the secular vocation. She has allowed work and religion to become separate departments, and is astonished to find that, as result, the secular work of the world is turned to purely selfish and destructive ends, and that the greater part of the world's intelligent workers have become irreligious, or at least, uninterested in religion. But is it astonishing? How can anyone remain interested in a religion which seems to have no concern with nine-tenths of his life? The Church's approach to an intelligent carpenter is usually confined to exhorting him not to be drunk and disorderly in his leisure hours, and to come to church on Sundays. What the Church should be telling him is this: that the very first demand that his religion makes upon him is that he should make good tables."

"No crooked table legs or ill-fitting drawers ever, I dare swear, came out of the carpenter's shop at Nazareth. Nor, if they did, could anyone believe that they were made by the same hand that made Heaven and earth. No piety in the worker will compensate for work that is not true to itself; for any work that is untrue to its own technique is a living lie."

"She [the Church] has forgotten that the secular vocation is sacred ... The Apostles complained rightly when they said it was not meet they should leave the word of God and serve tables; their vocation was to preach the word. But the person whose vocation it is to prepare the meals beautifully might with equal justice protest: It is not meet for us to leave the service of our tables to preach the word."

"The only Christian work is good work well done. Let the Church see to it that the workers are Christian people and do their work well, as to God: then all the work will be Christian work, whether it is church embroidery, or sewage farming."

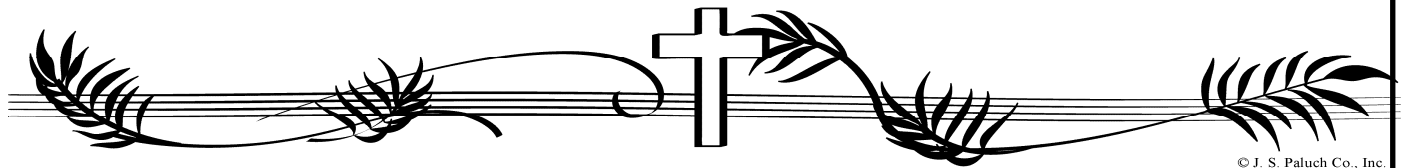

A Tribute to Fr. Michael Morris, O.P.

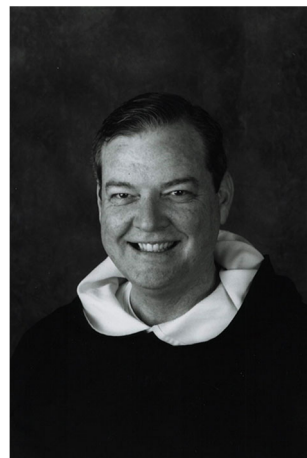


Born on October 19, 1949

Professed on September 16, 1972

Ordained on April 23, 1977

Died on July 15, 2016



Father Michael received his BFA from the University of Southern California, USC, in 1971. He entered the Order of Friars Preachers for the Western Dominican Province in the same year.

He was ordained as a priest on April 23, 1977.

Father Michael was awarded an MA in Art History from University of California, Berkeley in 1981,

Then, he studied at the world famous Courtauld Institute of Art in London, England.

The University of California conferred a doctoral degree, PhD, on him in Art History in 1986.

In 1991, his highly-acclaimed biography on "Madam Valentino: The Many Lives of Natacha Rambova" was published by Abbeville Press.

He has published many articles on Religious Art and Iconography since his days at Cal.
