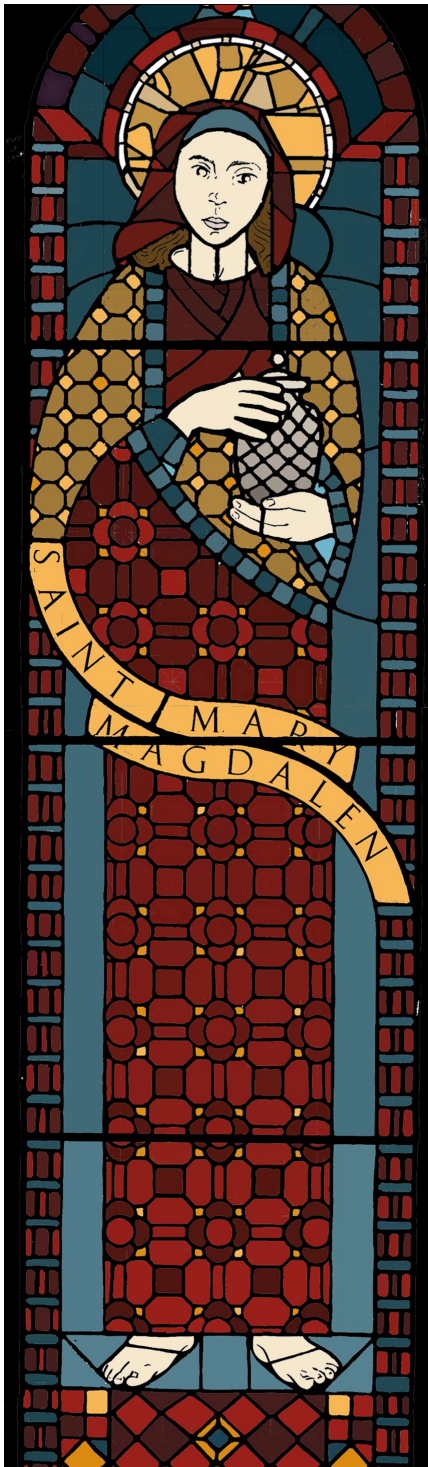

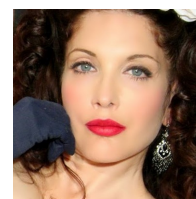

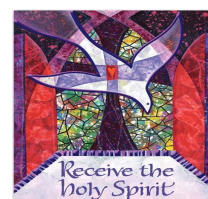

2018 Bishop's Appeal: 88% to Goal!



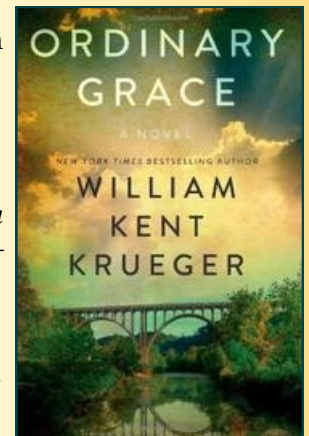

Pentecost

After Easter and Christmas, **Pentecost is the third most important feast in the Church.** The Gospels tell us that the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples this day and the Church was born. From then on, the Church spoke out fearlessly about Jesus' death and resurrection and the salvation of humankind.

There is some divergence between the Gospels about when the gift of the Holy Spirit occurred. John's Gospel records it happening on Easter Sunday. The other Gospels place it fifty days after the resurrection. For liturgical purposes, the Church has used the latter date, naming it Pentecost (the word comes from the Greek *pentēkostē*, meaning 'fiftieth'). The feast helps the Easter season draw to a close, and signifies the end of the period of *Mystagogia* (a Greek word for *training*) for those who are baptized at Easter.

For us, Pentecost commemorates the beginning of the work of the Church. We rededicate ourselves to ministering the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world around us. We renew our responsibility of living out our baptismal commitments. This doesn't necessarily take the form of formal missionary work or preaching, but it does mean that everything we do in our homes with our families, in our workplaces or at school, in our encounters with associates, and even strangers — it all must somehow reflect our belief in the Gospel.

The rhythm of our lives will now start to shift gears into summertime, back into Ordinary Time. It's important to remember that our faith doesn't take a vacation. Our celebration of Pentecost should send us forth over the next few months to relax a little, to perhaps enjoy life at a slower pace. But the days after Pentecost should also reflect the grace of God poured out onto all of us through the Holy Spirit on this transcendent feast.

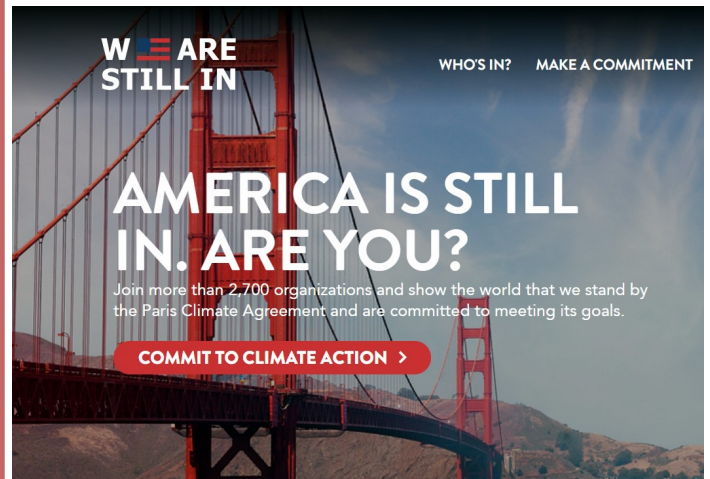

Social Justice Notes

Taking a Stand for the Planet

On June 1st of last year, the U.S. President announced his intention to withdraw from the 2015 Paris Climate Agreement. Many groups, *including the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops*, expressed disappointment with this move. A movement was quickly launched—the [We Are Still In](#) (WASI) campaign—to show the world that many of America's leaders stand by the Paris Agreement and are committed to meeting its goals. A year after the WASI declaration, the USCCB have taken a further step, inviting Catholic parishes to endorse the [Catholic Climate Declaration](#). This initiative aims to inspire and equip people and institutions to care for creation and for the poorest and most vulnerable people in our planet, in response to decades of Church teaching.

Fr. Nick has received a formal invitation from the USCCB to enroll our parish in this initiative. **Last week, the parish Social Justice/Refugee Aid Committee and Fr. Nick decided that our parish should support the Bishop's initiative, and 'St. Mary Magdalen Parish' will be added to the list of signers.**

Commitments to the [Catholic Climate Declaration](#) will be made public on June 18, 2018, the third anniversary of the release of Pope Francis' encyclical, [Laudato Si](#), "Care for Our Common Home."

The visitation program at the **West County Detention Center** has been reinstated. This program (now renamed [Freedom for Immigrants](#)) was created to combat the isolating experience of immigration detention. Volunteers meet with detainees regularly, build relationships with them and ensure that they can maintain family and community ties. For more information: [freedomforimmigrants.org](#).

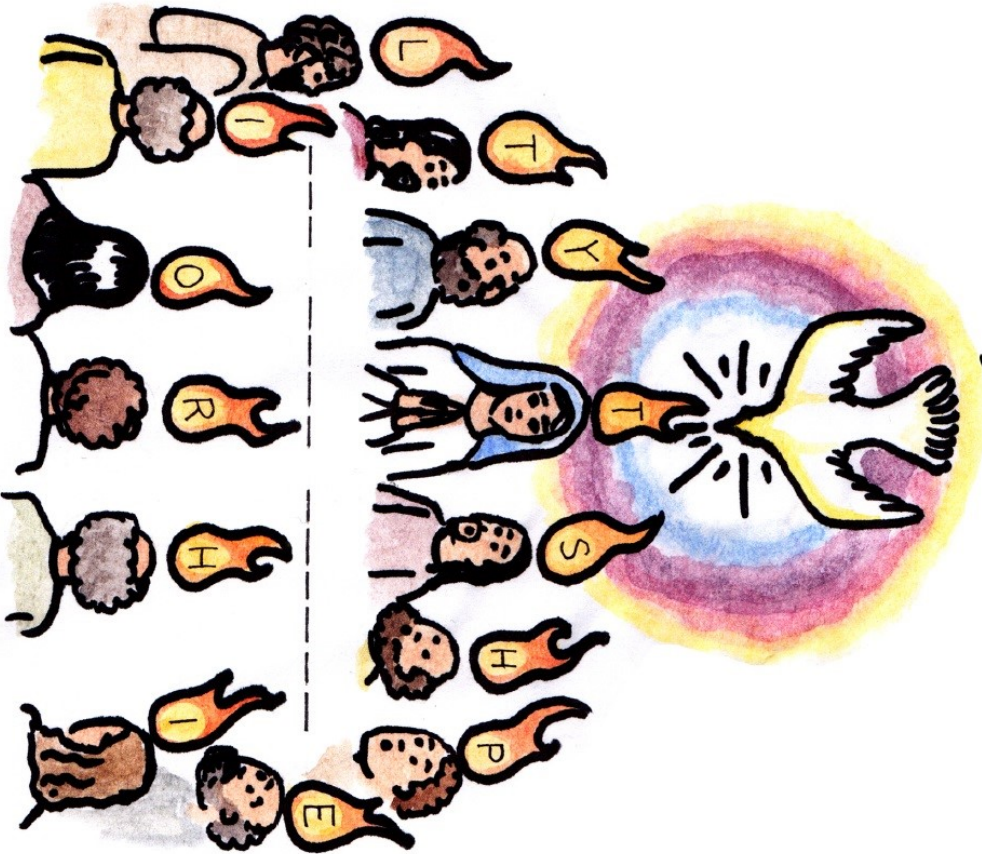
