Reception for Former Priest-in-Residence Fr. Laurent Okitakatshi: THIS SATURDAY, September 7th @ 6:30 pm in Norton Hall

Fr. Laurent came to our parish in 2017, one month after Fr. Nick's arrival and less than three weeks after his ordination to the priesthood in his native Congo. His brilliance as a preacher and his quietly profound spirituality eased us parishioners in our transition from a Dominican to a diocesan parish. Sadly, after only three years he left us to lead a Newman Center near St. Louis. Now, his Ph.D. accomplished, his bishop has appointed him President-Rector of the St. John Paul II Seminary in the Diocese of Tshumbe in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

Fr. Laurent will preach at all the Masses this weekend. Come on Saturday evening to watch his presentation on his new mission in the Congo! Wine, cheese, and tea sandwiches will be served to accompany a 25-minute film on Catholic life and culture in the largest country of sub-Saharan Africa. A Q&A period will follow. For those who are unable to attend the event on Saturday evening, Fr. Laurent will also be present during Coffee Hour the following morning, Sunday, September 8th.

I pray your peace into the hearts of those who hate, into the minds of those who live in anger, of those who long for revenge.


The hot winds of war sweep over so many lives, dear God, terror and cruelty following in their wake,




