Saint Andrew Kim 7aegeon



Apostolic work in Korea began late. Yet when the first missionaries arrived from France in 1836, they found that Catholicism had already taken root; the faith had been spread by laypeople. During the mid-19th century the Joseon Dynasty tried to suppress Christianity and many Catholics were martyred. Among them was Andrew Kim Tae-gŏn, the first native-born Korean Catholic priest.

Saint Andrew Kim was born to Catholic parents. After his father was martyred, Kim was baptized and he later went to seminary in the Portuguese colony of Macau (near Hong Kong). Ordained in Shanghai by the French bishop Jean-Joseph Ferréol, Kim returned to Korea with the bishop to evangelize his people. Andrew Kim was tortured and beheaded in 1846, at the age of 25.

St. Pope John Paul II canonized Kim along with 103 Korean martyrs during a trip to Korea in 1984. Their feast day is observed this Friday, September 20th.

Oakland is the home of the St. Andrew Kim Korean Pastoral Center. Although it is not a parish, it functions like one. It provides liturgy, sacraments and outreach to the Korean community in the East Bay. It is staffed by priests from the Catholic Church in Korea rather than the Diocese of Oakland. In effect, it is a mission of the Church in Korea. As far as I know, Korea is unique ministering to its expatriates this way. The cultural center enjoys a strong working relationship with the Oakland Diocese.

I pray for your peace in troubled lands, in places where people fear each day, in cities or villages under threat of danger.


I pray your peace into the hearts of those who hate, into the minds of those who live in anger, of those who long for revenge.


