Dominican Sisters

Lecito Divina, a Latin term, means "divine reading" and describes a way of reading the Scriptures whereby we gradually let go of our own agenda and open ourselves to what God wants to say to us. Lectio Divina or Praying with the Word of God, uses the upcoming Sunday Scriptures. Participants are provided the readings sent by email before each session. The session includes a prayer, two/three reflective readings of the Sunday Gospel with a reflective pause between each reading. It is Spirit led and allows for a deepening of God's Word that leads to living out its meaning in our lives.

My Retreat | St. Francis

The Church requires priests and deacons to make a spiritual retreat at least once a year. Our diocese also requires us to make it together with other priests of the Oakland diocese every other year. I will therefore be away at Villa Maria del Mar this coming week.

Retreats come in all sizes and flavors. There are always a few priests who complain our retreats are not spiritual enough. They would prefer monastic silence and continuous contemplation before the Blessed Sacrament. Monastic retreats are excellent occasions for spiritual growth, but they aren't the only means of prayer. and those so inclined are welcome to make that kind of retreat at another time.

Diocesan retreats tend to be more like reunions. We gather together for prayer

and relaxation with other priests in a way that our work often precludes during the rest of the year. We celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours and Eucharist every day, and time is also available for spiritual direction and Confession. But we also enjoy a lot of camaraderie, a good bit of food and drink, and time on the beach. This sounds a lot like the time Jesus spent with his apostles and disciples at the Sea of Galilee! If the Church didn't require our getting away, I'm afraid many of us would stay behind our desks dealing with the minor emergencies that take up so much of our lives.

Without this "away" time, many of us priests lose sight of the forest for the trees. Returning from retreat never fails to give me new insight into the goings-on of the parish, and we are all the better for that. Keep the priests of the Diocese of Oakland in your prayers this week.

Next weekend we'll be celebrating the **Feast of Saint Francis** at all Masses. **You are encouraged to bring your pets with you.** We deliberately schedule the blessings on Berryman Plaza in front of the church to

St. Mary Magdalen Children's Programs




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
