We hope to see you there!




Notes from Fr. Nick

St. Francis - The Pope's Patron

Friday, October 4th, is the Feast of St. Francis. *We'll be blessing your pets this weekend to celebrate the feast*. One doesn't have to be Catholic or even Christian to be aware of the example St. Francis set. St. Francis' call for radical poverty and harmony of all God's creation reminded people of his time that God's kingdom would not be found in wealth or power, but in **kindness**, **humility**, and **care for creation**.

If a problem exists with St. Francis' spirituality, it is that we can't all live it to the full. Personal temperament, family responsibilities, and the way our world is organized make it difficult to fully live Franciscan spirituality outside a monastery. Even Franciscan friars themselves find it challenging. The best that most of us can do is get as close to the ideal as possible. We can do this by actively giving to those in need, caring for our environment, and recognizing we are not the masters of our world.

When Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio assumed the name "Francis" as pope, his choice was a shocking statement about how he saw his papacy. Apparently, other popes had toyed with the idea of being called Francis, but they felt that St. Francis' example was so extreme that they might be criticized when they couldn't meet it. I doubt our pope has any illusions about matching the saint's sanctity, but he also feels we should challenge ourselves to be our best.



Pope Francis' choice is already having an impact. Early in his papacy he said that he would not judge gays and lesbians. He scandalized the establishment by washing the feet of women, Muslims, and people with AIDS. His encyclical on the environment, *Laudato Si'*, tied morality and spirituality to protecting God's creation. There has been pushback from those who feel they have a lot to lose, but the secular world is taking notice. This is what evangelization means in the 21st century!

As we celebrate St. Francis' feast day this weekend, are we ready to take up the saint's and the pope's challenge? Are we ready to look for more than practical solutions to the problems around us? Can we engage in dialogue with people of different mindsets and lifestyles with an openness and kindness toward them? Can we be challenged by a goal that we know we won't fully attain in this life?

This is what Saint Francis and Pope Francis are calling us to do. Let's raise our personal expectations, reorganize our priorities and treat others—and ourselves—a little more humanely.



St. Mary Magdalen Children's Programs

The Children's Liturgy of the Word Program for the school year 2024-2025 has begun, thanks to the dedication of the third— and fourth-grade parents! This liturgy-based program for pre-school through 4th-grade children takes place within the 9:30 am Mass. The children are "lovingly dismissed" just before the First Reading in order to share their own Liturgy of the Word experience with prayer, reading, activity, and reflection, after which the children return to the church.

Our Faith Formation Program begins today, Sunday, October 6th at 10:45 am. This program provides religious instruction and sacramental preparation for children in kindergarten



through 4th grade, and is geared towards the children of our parish who attend public or other private schools.

You are very welcome to come help set up or serve our guests (*see below*), but we especially need volunteers to clean the kitchen and Magdalen Hall.






