

Notes from Fr. Nick

Ministry Sunday

All adult Christians should engage in some form of ministry over the course of their lives. Celebrating Mass on Saturday or Sunday should prompt us to be involved in the work of Christ through the coming week. Mostly, this happens by carrying on with our regular lives, but exhibiting the mindfulness that comes from our relationship with Christ.



However, we can build up God's kingdom much more effectively when we work together. Perhaps the most direct way you can help our larger community is through Liturgical ministries. Lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, greeters, altar servers, choirs and sacristans are all needed to make our worship complete. The best part about these ministries is they take little extra time since you're already here for Mass.

Serving on the councils that advise me is another important work for church members. Our finance, liturgy and parish pastoral councils help set policies in our parish and with the administration of our church. Each

of these councils meets monthly or quarterly and gives me valuable information about what is and is not working at Saint Mary Magdalen. I rely on the expertise of these councils to lead the parish.

Social justice and charitable ministries are well represented in our parish. Our St. Vincent de Paul Society helps local people who can't make ends meet. Our Dinners for the Hungry happen on the first and fourth Sundays of each month. The Peace and Justice committee works to overcome the causes of poverty and injustice. These groups meet monthly and exemplify what it means to live the Gospel.

Christian life isn't only about worship and righting wrongs. Our two Gospel reflection groups meet on Tuesday afternoons and Friday mornings, and deepen their members' understanding of the scriptures; the new Men's Spirituality Group helps men to understand their role in our Church and society.

I'm sure I've left out some important groups, but I hope you get the picture: there is a ministry for everyone

in our church. While there are plenty of people who truly do not have time at this point in their lives, most of us can spare the little time it takes for training and practice. Participating in a ministry helps immeasurably in building God's kingdom, and gives us a sense of fulfilment that is priceless.

Next weekend, we will try something new to help you join one of the parish ministries. By now you will have heard brief explanations of many parish ministries over the last few weeks



at the end of Mass. When you arrive for Mass next weekend, you will find posters for these and other ministries around the church. After Mass we will encourage all of you to attach your names (on a post-it note) to one or more of these ministries. Later we will contact you about how to get started in your selected ministries. While some of them require a little training, you can participate in many ministries at the Mass you already attend, and so your service will take very little additional time out of your life, and will bring you closer to your vocation as a Christian.

St. Mary Magdalen Children's Programs

The Children's Liturgy of the Word Program for the school year 2024-2025 has begun, thanks to the dedication of the third—and fourth-grade parents! This liturgy -based program for pre-school through 4th-grade children takes place within the 9:30 am Mass. The children are "lovingly dismissed" just before the First Reading in order to share their own Liturgy of the Word experience with prayer, reading, activity, and reflection, after which the children return to the church.

Our **Faith Formation Program** began just last Sunday. It provides religious instruction and sacramental preparation for children in **kindergarten through fourth grade**, and is geared towards the children of our parish who attend public or other private schools. It takes place in the school at **10:45 am.**

The **Family Liturgy Program** is run by Heather Skinner, our DRE, and normally takes place on Fourth Sundays. If you would like for your child to be involved with any of these programs,




The rich young man in today's Gospel reading was sad because Jesus told him to sell his things and give his money to the poor.


