

Notes from Fr. Nick

PROPHET SONG

Years ago, my cousin Jim said of the film *Schindler's List*, "It was one of the best films I ever saw, and I never want to see it again!" Although I saw it more than once, I completely understood his sentiments. The film was so devastating that watching it was almost an ordeal that should be experienced only once.



I feel the same way about Paul Lynch's *Prophet Song*. The novel confronts the reader with the horrors of war so vividly that I dreaded reading it, but I couldn't put it down. The story follows Eilish Stack and her family as they are wrenched from middle-class contemporary Dublin into the depravity of civil war. I won't spoil the plot for you, except to say in the end nothing is really resolved and there is only the faintest glimmer of hope.

This is as dark as literature gets, and part of that darkness is because the story feels like a prediction. A free and fair election leads to an authoritarian state. Soon enough, political advisories are called in for questioning and disappear. An opposition builds and soon enough civil war ensues. In the meanwhile, the international community sits on the sidelines, lacking the will to intervene.

Lynch was clever to set the story in a modern democracy. He brings home the fact that our freedom is far less robust than most of us assume. More than once I said to myself that this kind of animal behavior could not happen in our world, only to remind myself it happens every day in

the Middle East, Africa, Ukraine and Latin America.

Where is the Catholic Church in this very Irish novel? While I know that the Irish people have largely abandoned the Church since the pedophile scandal, other contemporary authors, such as Colm Tóibín acknowledge the Church's presence as part of the fabric of Ireland. It would seem that for bad or good, the Church should factor in the story, but it does not. Only in a couple of places is there the faintest attempt at a prayer. Perhaps the absence of faith helps contribute to the novel's utter despair.

Aside from the deeply disturbing story, I have only one major peeve with Lynch's writing: he uses almost no punctuation, and lumps everything into pages-long paragraphs. More than once I had to reread passages to determine who was speaking. And yet his style contributes to the deepening chaos the book portrays.

Don't read this book if you are easily depressed. On the other hand, if you want to read an engrossing cautionary tale, Paul Lynch's *Prophet Song* will reach you at a profound level.




