



Notes from Fr. Nick



People frequently ask me, "What can I do to deepen my faith?" My response, without hesitation, is: "Sponsor somebody who wants to become Catholic." Usually, this is not the answer they are expecting or want. They would like me to recommend a course or book that will open their minds to a deeper understanding of their relationship with God, but this method will ultimately fall short.

The problem is that the response they seek is personal and private, while true spiritual growth comes corporately rather than in a solitary quest. Courses, retreats, reading books and attending Mass are an important part of getting to know God, but Jesus repeatedly directed his followers to integrate themselves into the greater People of God. Beyond a certain point, deepening one's spiritual life requires an expanded mindset that sees the face of Jesus in the people around us.

Leading another person to the joys of Christian life is by far the best way I know to expand one's faith. You won't have all the answers for this prospective Christian, but the search together while sharing your own journey will expose you to elements of faith that no other means can accomplish. One has to be open and vulnerable, rather than to act as an "authority." If you want to broaden your faith beyond a certain point, you must accept occasionally feeling a little uncomfortable.

If you're willing to accept this challenge, we need sponsors for people who are on their own search for a deeper relationship

with God. They have joined our Adult Christian Initiation process and recognize that knowing Christ means membership among the People of God. Some are seeking the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Others were baptized in another Christian faith and now want full communion with the Catholic Church. Still others want to complete the Sacraments of Initiation they began when they were young.

The time commitment for sponsors is significant, but no more so than taking a theology course would be. You will be with your candidate for a Sunday liturgy that you would be attending anyway. There are a couple of liturgies at the Cathedral we recommend you attend and, most importantly, you will accompany them to the Easter Vigil when your candidate is fully initiated into the Church.

I hope that you'll consider sponsoring one of the people who are exploring becoming a member of the Catholic Church. I can say with certainty that your faith will grow as a result and you will have engaged in a major spiritual work of mercy. Your faith will develop in ways you cannot now imagine, and you will have the eternal gratitude of someone who has entered the life of grace.


