

BAPTISM: Preparation classes take place on the first Monday of the month. Please call the parish office for more information.


CONFIRMATION: Classes run from September through May; contact the office for more information.

## Notes from Fr. Nick



As I mentioned in this column a few weeks back, Advent is the beginning of a new Church year, when we prepare for the feast of the Incarnation: Christmas. In many ways our culture gets the Christmas season backwards. We have our office Christmas parties, holiday concerts, and gift exchanges before the feast, and then pack everything away the day after Christmas.

For the Church, the feast begins on the Vigil of Christmas: Christmas Eve. The actual celebration continues for the next eight days – the Octave of Christmas – and the season ends on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 12<sup>th</sup> this year).

How can we keep faithful to the spirit of Advent and still rejoice with our secular friends as they celebrate our feast? Perhaps the best thing we can do is keep it in perspective. We don't want to be like sour grapes when others choose to celebrate with us but don't get it quite right, and yet we need to be focused on the preparatory nature of the season so that we're not burned out by the time the feast arrives.

These are some things you could to do help you this Advent:

- Observe the feast of Saint Nicholas (December 6<sup>th</sup>).
- ♦ Attend Mass on the **Feast of the Immaculate Conception.**It is a special challenge this year, as it falls on a Sunday. The U.S. bishops have moved the celebration to Monday, December 9<sup>th</sup>, and is it is a **Holy Day of Obligation**.
- Resolve to attend a **Reconciliation Service** (ours is on Monday, December 16<sup>th</sup>) and confess your sins.
- Sing the wonderful **Advent repertoire of hymns** at liturgy, and save Christmas carols until later.
- Read all of the **Gospel of Luke** (you may continue it into the coming year) as a preparation.









Offer up the extra work you do at this time of year as preparation for the feast.

Christmas falls on Wednesday this year, and so, unlike in some previous years, it won't get in the way of celebrating the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We'll keep the Advent decorations in the inside of the church until the following Monday, but we'll install our outdoor Christmas decorations somewhat earlier for our neighbors to enjoy. I wish each of you a blessed Advent.

## A CALL TO END THE DEATH PENALTY

Currently 40 federal prisoners are on death row. Capital punishment has no place in our Catholic faith: Pope Francis formally changed the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* to unambiguously oppose the death penalty, eliminating its use in extreme cases and calling it "inadmissible."

President Biden never abolished the federal death penalty. Instead he placed a moratorium on federal executions following the 13 executions in the final six months of Trump's first presidency. Prior to the these executions, no federal execution had taken place since 2003.

What can we do? Join the call of the *American Civil Liberties Union* and **sign a petition urging President Biden to commute the sentence of these 40 individuals before he leaves office.** Otherwise the next president will be able to resume executions, as he did in his first presidency.


December 15th. On that morning (12/15), we'll be

You can also visit the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' website to read more information about Catholic teachings and about the death penalty. (Unfortunately, no current actions by the USCCB against the death penalty are evident.) Both the House and the Senate introduced bills in 2023 entitled "The Federal Death Penalty Prohibition Act"; the bills rest in their respective Judiciary Committees; future action is unclear. Let us be reminded: Pope Francis has enjoined us to "collectively call for the abolition of the death penalty."



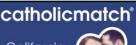
