


#### **Attention All Bakers!**

Our guests like sweets and really appreciate your desserts. You may drop them off during Coffee Hour or in the Magdalen kitchen until 1:30 pm.



The Jubilee Year that we are about to enter needs peacemakers who are called the children of God (Matthew 5:9) in these challenging, uncertain times. "The need for peace challenges us all and demands that concrete steps be taken," Pope Francis instructs us. This is why Catholic Mobilizing Network has



initiated a national petition for Catholics to urge President Biden —a fellow Catholic — to act in the spirit of mercy and justice to commute the sentences of all 40 men currently on federal death row. Mr. Biden made history as the first U.S. president to openly oppose the death penalty. But while federal executions have been paused during the Biden presidency, 40 lives are still at stake, with a new administration weeks away. **Until he leaves office, President** 

Biden has the constitutional authority to offer clemency to each person on federal death row.

At a time when the Holy Father has called for "forgiveness, reconciliation, and an end to every form of death penalty," such a bold Jubilee action from President Biden would not only leave open the door to redemption for these men, but also quite possibly mark a turning point in the movement to end the scourge of capital punishment throughout the United States.

# Christmas Greetings

The words that begin the Proclamation of the Scriptures at the Christmas Vigil liturgy almost fluoresce with brilliance:

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings glad tidings, announcing peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation, and saying to Zion, "Your God is King!"


- Isaiah 52:7

The writer, probably a student of Isaiah, cannot contain his excitement at the coming of the Messiah. You might, therefore, be surprised to learn that they were written as Israel approached one of its darkest hours. Revolts occurred within, and foreign powers encroached on God's chosen people from all sides.

What could be a cause of joy when Israel was in the midst of such peril? The prophet was able to see the larger picture. He knew that, even when things looked like they could not get worse; the love of God was still present. God's love would ultimately triumph over human greed and lust for power.

During the season of the Incarnation, the memorial of God becoming a human being, it is good to look beyond the things that appear to overwhelm us. The birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus reminds us that nothing can overcome God's care for us. This sure knowledge transforms how we see our world so that, like Isaiah's student, we understand its true beauty. We can relish the life God has given us.

On behalf of Fr. Wilson, Fr. Titus, Deacon Jeff and all the staff, Merry Christmas to all, and may God's blessings be on you during 2025.


