Notes from Fr. Nick

Patricia Eileen Apone Glisson RIP

My mother, Pat Glisson, was the soul and compass of the Glisson family for most of her 96 years. Born on June 15th, 1928, to Nicholas and Katherine Apone in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, Pat spent her childhood in Youngstown and Warren, Ohio. In 1946, her family relocated to Sarasota, Florida, and Pat completed her nurse's training at Saint Vincent's Hospital in Jacksonville.

In 1950 Pat married James T. ("Jake") Glisson II, who would become an artist and writer, with her assistance, through their many years of marriage. Jake may have given the family an artistic flair, but it was Pat who kept everyone grounded. She saw to her five children's Catholic faith, education and welfare. Through her encouragement and support, her children's careers and families took shape. She gave her children a sharp wit, intellectual curiosity and love of the arts.

Although at heart a homebody, Pat became a world traveler as she journeyed far from the family home in Evinston, south of Gainesville. Her husband Jake's work took them to Mexico, Argentina and Germany.

A wicked sense of humor was one of Pat's trade

marks. It ranged from erudite to naughty and macabre. Pets were always
part of her family. When asked if she liked them more than people, her
silence gave answer. Her musical tastes ranged from classical to bluegrass,
and she played the accordion with a vengeance.

Pat was not without her foibles. She managed to raise rather punctual children who learned to endure her perennial tardiness. She had a penchant for losing things—once, an entire cooked ham just before dinner! She was far

more interested in good conversation with old friends, devouring the latest *New York*

Times bestseller or helping one of her children with a school project than with domestic duties.

Never a high-energy person, her husband's passing in 2019 and the pandemic began Pat's decline. On February 7th, 2025, her body finally just gave up. The Magnolia Ridge Rehabilitation Center in Gainesville had ably cared for her since August 2022.

Patricia is survived by her sister, Kay Ponder; her children, Nicholas, James Thomas III, Steven, and Jeannie; her grandchildren, James Thomas IV, Nathaniel, and Fiona; plus numerous nieces and nephews. Her son Will and her sister Anita preceded her in death.

A funeral Vigil will be held for Pat at the Methodist church in Evinston on Wednesday, February 19th. The Mass of Christian Burial will follow at Holy Faith Catholic Church in Gainesville the next day, followed by a reception. Interment will take place at the family gravesite in Citra.

JustFaith Lenten Series


Would you like to enrich your Lent this year?


