

Notes from Fr. Nick

Rite of Election and Scrutinies

In a previous column I discussed how the original purpose of Lent was to prepare Catechumens for baptism into the Christian faith and Candidates for full communion with the Catholic Church. Lent originally was a time meant to test whether or not a person was worthy to become a full member of the Church and, more recently, a period of soul-searching for making this momentous decision.

Beyond classes, fasting, prayer and general help from the faithful, there are rituals intended to assist each person who desires to be a full member of the Church. The two most important rituals are the **Rite of Election** and the **Scrutinies**.

The **Rite of Election** is an endorsement by the Church that a person is ready to take the final steps toward membership in the Christian community. In recent times, this ritual has been celebrated by the bishop. It is an acknowledgement that the greater Church—beyond the local parish—accepts and encourages a person to continue on their path to God. The local Church participates with a **Rite of Sending** beforehand that prepares aspirants to meet the chief shepherd of our diocese, the bishop.

After the Rite of Election, each Catechumen or Candidate undergoes a series of **Scrutinies** on the third, fourth and fifth weeks of Lent. The Scrutinies are intended to focus the person on the privileges and responsibilities of being a Christian and a Catholic. They include a prayer of exorcism to drive out any evil or hindrance that could detour these persons from their journey to Christ.

I hope that you will be present at the liturgies in which these moving rituals are celebrated. Also, it is our duty as fully-initiated Christians to **pray**, **fast**, **and engage in good works** for the grace to speed our Catechumens and Candidates on their passage to God's kingdom.






