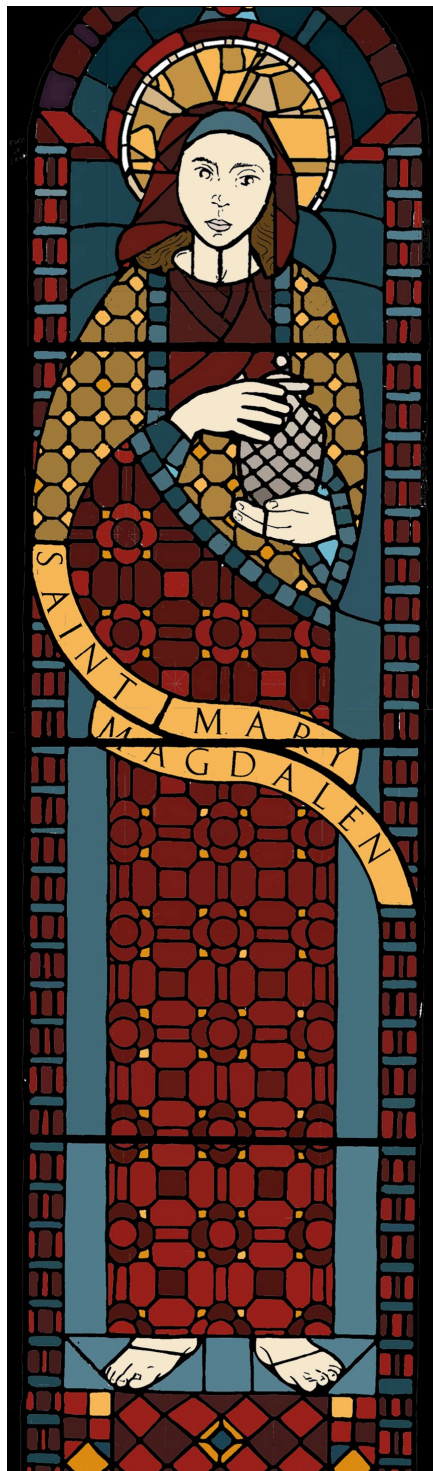

"Alleluia, the Lord has risen!"

Blessings on all who are graced by the waters of baptism. Easter is the feast of triumph over our human weakness. It is not our personal triumph, but God's victory over human pettiness, selfishness and sinfulness. We are privileged to share in this triumph by the Lord's love and generosity for us.

Human beings are blessed and cursed with self-awareness: blessed because we know we can be better, and cursed because we cannot lift ourselves out of our humanity. No human being can transcend himself or herself. Yet we, both as individuals and collectively, bear responsibility for our failings. Thus, it took a human being—who is also God—to bring us beyond our limitations. Jesus Christ, the human being, can stand up for our sin. Jesus Christ the Son of God, can raise us out our human nature.

This is what is so significant about the Paschal Mystery: Jesus takes on our guilt in his passion and death. In his resurrection, we are raised up to become children of God. Our celebration of Easter is a great

thanksgiving for the gift of transcendence. We are not just forgiven, we are made new.

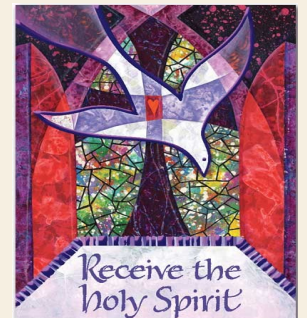

1st Sunday Dinner for the Poor: Today!

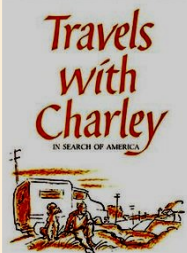
He is risen - Alleluia! Rise to the occasion and lend a hand at today's 1st Sunday Dinner for the Poor and Homeless.

Berkeley Mayor Jesse Arreguin went back to school
 Wednesday to share his inspiring story with our 3rd-
 graders and their 8th-grade buddies. Arreguin, the



son of Central Valley farmworkers, told students he
 attended Catholic schools in San Francisco and was
 influenced by the social movements around him.

When he was only 9, Arreguin helped lead the effort
 to change Army Street to Cesar Chavez Street! The
 mayor's story helped plant a seed in our third graders
 that they have a voice, even at such a young age. Our
 eighth graders also gained awareness about how
 their actions can impact their community. *That belief,
 in the power to do good, to fight for what you believe
 in, is what the School of the Madeleine is all about.*
