





What Does the St. Mary Magdalen Conference of St. Vincent de Paul Actually Do?

Last week's bulletin reported on a resident of our parish who recently received one-time help from St. Vincent de Paul with paying her rent, and another whose EBMUD bill St. Vincent de Paul took care of because she had no money left after buying rain gear for her children. As Dr. Troy Kaji noted, "St. Mary Magdalen parishioners are helping to break the cycle of 'Robbing Peter to pay Paul'."

People living below the poverty line in North Berkeley and Albany often call the parish office asking for help with groceries. Each person is individually interviewed (over the phone) by Troy or another St. Vincent de Paul Conference member, and if their request is deemed sincere, she or he is awarded one or two \$25 Safeway gift cards, depending on the number of people they are supporting. Their identities are verified, and no one may apply more than once a month.

You can donate to St. Vincent de Paul this weekend, knowing that your funds will be dispensed wisely. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

St. Joseph the Worker

This **Tuesday**, **May** 1st, is the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. Like so many other feasts, the Church established it in response to events in the larger world. Communism had designated May Day as a celebration of the common worker. Pope Pius XII capitalized on this holiday by celebrating Saint Joseph, patron of workers, on the same date. The feast entered the Church's calendar in 1955.

There is a mentality in America that work is a necessary evil. It is something we have to do in order to make money so we can take time off. Anyone who thinks this way is missing out on

one of the true joys of human life. Many people toil at difficult and uninteresting jobs out of necessity, but ideally work should engage our minds and bodies to the world around us.

Work has an honored place in creation. The book of Genesis tells us that human beings were placed on the earth to "cultivate and care for it" (Gen. 2:15). *God expected us to engage in work even before sin entered the world.* Therefore, work can hardly be seen as a necessary evil.

What place does work have in your life? Does it come from a passion or bliss? (Mine certainly does.) If not, can you do anything to elevate work into something more rewarding? Monastic spirituality speaks of "opus Dei," or the work of God. With this idea, monks try to be mindful of God's presence, even in the simple things they do. Bringing the dimension of prayer to your work may give everyday tasks meaning and make your life more fulfilling.

St. Joseph the Worker is the patron of our neighboring parish to the South. We congratulate them as they celebrate this week. When I came to Berkeley in 1990 in preparation for attending the Graduate Theological Union, **Fr. Bill O'Donnell**, the Pastor, invited me to live at St. Joseph the Worker in exchange for help with Mass and religious education. Fr. Bill was an outspoken activist for social justice, and I assured him I did not have a problem with his parish's work in human rights.

Fr. Bill was also a little absent minded. After driving back to Florida, I sent him a letter confirming our agreement. In a matter of days, Fr. Bill called me to apologize: he explained that he had forgotten about me, and that another priest had already moved in. When I began my doctoral studies, I wound up living at Santa Maria in Orinda instead.

I've often wondered how things would have turned out if my life in California had begun in the Berkeley flats, rather than in the Orinda hills!

News from the School of the Madeleine Ken Willers Resigns as Principal;




Last week Ken Willers announced that he will soon be leaving his position as principal and starting a new job as **Assistant Superintendent of Leadership and Innovation for the Diocese of Oakland.** In a joint letter issued by Mr. Willers and Fr. Nick, he revealed that his time at the School of the Madeleine "has been transformative personally and professionally." He expressed gratitude for his "eight marvelous years of collaborating with amazing educators, creating with committed board members, engaging with supportive parents, and overseeing such delightful and gifted children."

Fr. Nick is pleased to inform St. Mary Magdalen parishioners that he offered to appoint Vice Principal Joseph Nagel as principal, and he is delighted that Mr. Nagel has accepted. Over the past two-and-half years, Mr. Nagel has worked very closely with Mr. Willers at every level of administration. Our next principal has a Master's Degree in Education, along with a B.A. in Comparative Literature as well as California teaching and administrative credentials.
