

According to a reviewer in the *New York Journal of Books*, after writing "a dozen 'Cork O'Connor crime novels', Mr. Kruger took a break to give us a standalone story, this one also set in Minnesota, but about a boy coming to manhood....

"Mr. Kruger's prose has been described by others as 'pitch perfect' —a compliment hard to improve upon. He has an ear for just the right tone—whether in word, setting, sense, or emotion—that makes his novels ring true. " An example: "To this day there are pieces I cannot hear without imagining my sister's fingers shaping the music every bit as magnificently as God shaped the wings of butterflies."

First Eucharist

Next Saturday some of our young people will make another step toward being adult members of the Church: they will receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time. They will thus begin a practice that will sustain their faith for the rest of their lives. Communion will give them the sacramental grace to live out their baptismal call in their families, work and community.

Will they be able to fulfill the commitment they are making by receiving the sacrament? Ultimately, it is God's grace that will answer that question, but if their faith is not regularly nurtured in their families, the chances of living as a mature Christian are diminished.

Some of the children in our parish report that they don't attend Sunday Mass. When I ask "Why?", the most common response is that their parents don't take them. When we allow sports programs, media and common laziness to crowd out the regular celebration of Sunday Mass, our chil-

dren's faith is undermined. *Until they can come to Mass on their own, it is the parents' grave responsibility to attend Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) Mass with their children*. Secular activities have their place during the rest of the week or later in the day.

Worship is one of the key building blocks to a person's character. If we complain about the decline of our culture and do not attend to our families' spiritual needs, we are part of that decline.

Congratulations to our First Communicants and their families! Let this liturgy be the beginning of a lifelong pattern of meeting God's love by gathering in church and receiving the Sacraments.

Human Rights for Honduras

Padre Melo is the Director of Radio Progreso, an independent Jesuit-run radio station in Honduras. The Jesuits work with Honduras' most vulnerable communities and do the dangerous work of reporting on human rights violations, police and military abuses, and election fraud. Last year, the station's broadcast tower was knocked out in order to diminish national access to information about the presidential election.


