

Father's Day

The famous scripture scholar, Raymond Brown, once wrote: "There are only two words we can be absolutely certain Jesus spoke, 'Abba', and 'Amen'." The first one is significant for Fathers' Day. Abba is a Hebrew word that literally means 'Daddy'. That this word is prominent in the Gospels says much about Jesus' relationship with his heavenly Father and a lot about the nature of fatherhood for Christian men.

Without diminishing these characteristics in mothers, society puts many expectations on fathers. They are to be protectors, providers, mentors, correctors, defenders and leaders. There is a certain fierceness that is expected of fathers that inspires both respect and fear. All of these traits are also attributed to God the Father, but there is another quality that's not so easy to define: an intimate confidence in the ideal of fatherhood that reflects an unlimited love between father and child. This rapport can be summarized in the way Jesus used the word *Abba*.

As fathers, do we allow our children to be close enough to us that they can curl up in our arms and call us 'Daddy'? When we are older children, do we allow our fathers' continued intimacy? Jesus tells us that this intimacy is the ideal relationship between God and ourselves. As we celebrate Fathers' Day this year, let us take some time to consider the ideal parent-child relationship, and the ideal of our relationship with God.

On Saturday, June 9th, Deacon **David Paternostro**, **SJ**, was ordained a priest by **Archbishop Terrence Prendergast**, **SJ**, of Ottawa. Social Justice Notes

Final Week of the Poor People's Campaign ... Which is About All of Us!

The 40-day **Campaign** ends this week, and will culminates with a major demonstration at the U.S. Capitol on June 23rd. The final theme —"A **New and Unsettling Force: Confronting the Distorted Moral Narrative"**—emphasizes the profound consequences of a distorted moral narrative that ignores poverty, healthcare, decent jobs, and other crises facing the poor in the U.S. today. The **Campaign** points out that an estimated 10,000 people will die every year from a new federal tax bill provision that will take away healthcare from 13 million people. Thousands have already died because some states have denied Medicaid expansion. Already over 250,000 people die from poverty and related issues every year.

The aim of the **Campaign** is hold our leaders to account for these realities. It demands that we ground budget allocations in a *moral narrative that prioritizes* and follows our deepest religious commitments to justice, and in the Constitutional purpose of our Government: "... to establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity." This is why the **Campaign** is relevant and important to <u>all of us</u>.

Reminder: the Poor People's Campaign echoes and renews the call for a 'revolution of values' launched 50 years ago by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. To Dr. King's "triplets of evil" — militarism, racism, and economic injustice — has been added a fourth evil: ecological devastation, which disproportionately affects poor communities.

The Catholic Climate Declaration, an initiative of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, aims to inspire and equip people and institutions to care for creation and for the poorest and most vulnerable people in the planet. Parishes throughout the country have endorsed the Declaration, which will be made public on June 18th, the third anniversary of the release of Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si*. 



