





Notes from Fr. Nick

Saint Mary Magdalen Festival



One of my first homilies as the new pastor at Saint Mary Magdalen was on our patron's feast. As a confidante of Jesus, Mary Magdalen shaped the Church in profound ways. Here are a few ways Mary Magdalen and other women continue to breathe the Spirit into the Church:

As a woman, Mary Magdalen's presence confirmed the fact that women were a part of Christ's inner circle. The male-centric ancient world struggled with this fact, and we are still working out the role of women in the Church today. But, because she and other women of the New Testament were crucial to the story of Jesus' life, it has been hard to push them out of the picture. Mary Magdalen continues to challenge the *status quo* in the Church.

Saint Luke mentions that Mary Magdalen was among the women who provided financially for the needs of Jesus, and who, along with the other disciples, accompanied him as he traveled proclaiming the Gospel (Luke 8:1-3). We can infer that Mary was, therefore, a woman of means. She did not merely receive the Good News, but actively provided for Jesus' minis-

try. Her actions were a sign of her real commitment to Jesus, and to his message.

Mary Magdalen was fearless. She was risking her life to care for Jesus' lifeless body, yet she went to the tomb to perform the prescribed anointings. For this act of devotion, Christ rewarded her as the first person to be privileged to see him raised from the dead. In turn, she became the evangelist of the Risen Christ.

Falling in July, Mary Magdalen's feast comes at a relatively quiet time of year. Rather than just celebrating her solemnity on Sunday, we are honoring Mary with a festival. On Saturday morning, we are hosting a 'Prescott Lecture' in the church on Mary Magdalen's presence in Renaissance and Baroque music, complete with live music. For Sunday, our music director, Andy Canepa, has been rehearsing with the 9:30 and 11:00 am choirs to provide special music at those Masses, and will present a 'Mini-Concert' (roughly 15 minutes) immediately after the 11:00 Mass. In addition, a special speaker will be giving her reflections during the homily time at *all* weekend Masses.

Finally, I am inviting all of you to join me in **continuing the celebration downstairs in the Rectory after the 11:00 am Mass.**


