





Notes from Fr. Nick

Back to School

Students return to The School of the Madeleine this week, and other schools have already started their classes. Our Faith Formation program is also beginning classes later this month. (See below.)

Returning to school always seems to quicken the pace of our lives. Vacations have ended, the Indian summer begins, we look forward to a more focused autumn. This usually means an increase in Church attendance and more activities in the parish ministries as well.

Perhaps it may be appropriate to reflect on how this shift of gears affects our spiritual lives. Hopefully, this hasn't been neglected over the summer, but we should be ready for it to take on new shape in the fall. I'm not implying that you should necessarily take on added spiritual and religious activities. What I am suggesting is that

If we're finding school events, church activities, soccer and scouting, etc. are only increasing the frenzy of our lives, then we should take stock of what needs to be jettisoned so that we're back in control. On the other hand, the very vigor of the last months of the year may be the occasion for a deepening of our relationship with Christ through each other.

School Corner

News from the <u>School of the Madeleine</u> Interview with the Incoming Principal [Excerpts]

Ken Willers: You started here as a Kindergartener, graduated in 8th grade as a 'lifer', returned as a teacher's aide, stepped into the shoes of vice principal, and are now preparing to take on the role of principal. What does that kind of perspective give you as you prepare to take on this new role?



Joseph Nagel: I am proud to have spent so much of my life, in so many different stages, at the Madeleine. All of my education was in Berkeley: I went to Saint Mary's College High School, and then on to UC Berkeley. But the Madeleine has always been the 'second home' that formed my understanding of myself and of the world. *The nine years that students spend in Catholic parochial school define who they are and who they will become.* Having my two sons at the Madeleine is a wonderful blessing. I will approach my new role as principal with the layered insight and perspective of an alumnus, a teacher, a parent and a parishioner.

KW: What are the next steps for the school in terms of growing and building over the next three years?

JN: We have seen such wonderful changes and upgrades under the eight years of your leadership. I'm excited to move ahead with the *plans to convert the convent into a STEAM center*, where students can engage in hands-on lessons and activities that integrate disciplines of science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics. *I would also like to emphasize the components of service and ministry in this new project*. We are lucky to have the resources to make this vision a reality.

I would like the students to be able to *direct their* energies and efforts in the STEAM program towards service-oriented goals that reach out to others in need. I am confident that the Madeleine will continue to grow and improve, while always maintaining its essential culture, character and community.

KW: *Is there anything you'd like us to know about you and your philosophy as an educator?*

JN: As I reflect back on my career, I think the clearest lesson is that the quality of our relationships defines our experience. *Students learn when they feel safe and loved.* Our families work hard and make sacrifices to bring their children to school ready to learn. We have a sacred trust and commitment to uphold for our Madeleine families. I can think of no greater responsibility, nor greater honor.

Social Justice Notes

Update on the Contra Costa Detainees

As of Friday, August 17th, only 8 people remained at the Center; all others had been transferred earlier, either out-of-state or to jails hours away. The transfers included those with bond hearings scheduled in San Francisco; these transfers may have ended their access to hearings. This is a blatant ICE practice to skirt due process and to retaliate against locally-organized deportation defense. In response, the **Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity** last week organized a phone campaign to elected officials urging ICE <u>to</u> <u>return removed detainees for their hearings and to</u> <u>release immigrants still in custody</u>. Please keep them in your prayers, remembering this core tenet: *all human life "is sacred across all borders."*

How You Can Help Asylum Seekers

Do you have a spare room? An unused in-law unit? Rental property in the East Bay? The Refugee Aid Committee often receives requests for housing for immigrants and their families. They vary from accommodations for a few days (so families can attend a nearby court hearing) to a month of housing prior to resettlement elsewhere, to long-term rent-paying units for families who remaining here.


