



Notes from Fr. Nick

St. Vincent de Paul (1576-1660)

Saint Vincent de Paul, whose feast day is September 27th, had a profound impact on the Catholic Church. His work with the poor and underprivileged, as well as his reform of the education of priests, has had a lasting impact to this day.

St. Vincent's efforts to reform seminary education are not often discussed, but are no less consequential than his work for the poor. Before his time, training for the priesthood was often just an 'apprenticeship' with the local pastor. When the candidate was able to pronounce enough Latin to say all the words of the Mass, the bishop would ordain him. This led to extreme inconsistencies in priestly quali-



fications. St. Vincent created standards for priestly education and established the seminary system as



we know it today. For all the problems the priesthood has recently faced, we can still be proud of an educated clergy, and we owe a debt to St. Vincent for his work in this area.


Saint Vincent's ministry to the poor is much better known. He inspired lay people and religious to work directly with the most vulnerable of the world, and that work continues today in the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in 1833 by his admirer, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam. Members of our parish's St. Vincent de Paul Conference work directly with people living in our

neighborhood to help them rise out of poverty. This can take the form of financial assistance (including to those immigrants working in the stables at Golden Gate Fields) and counseling.

I hope that you will be generous next weekend, when our 5th Sunday Collection will be dedicated to the work of our own Conference of St.

Vincent de Paul. Even more appreciated would be the contribution of your time and talent, working directly with those who need a helping hand. The cost of living and the gentrification of Berkeley and Albany have placed people of even moderate income on the edge of financial collapse, and our Conference of St.



Social Justice Notes

Immigrants Still Need Our Help!

Although all the detained immigrants at the West County Detention Facility (WCDF) have been moved to out-of-state prisons, we can still help them in one of the following ways:

- 1) A Su Lado / By Your Side is a volunteer project created to give support to families in their immigration court hearings in San Francisco. One-day volunteers attend the court hearings at 630 Sansome Street (an easy walk from BART) to show their support for a person being held in detention by ICE. The aim is to "pack the court" and hopefully influence the outcome of the hearing. Several members of our parish have joined in this mission of compassion. To sign up, contact Hugo at hlopez@im4humanintegrity.org.
- **2) Bond funds** are still urgently needed. The WCDF Community Fund raised a total of \$130,100 to aid families with loved ones in detention or to post bond for those who were detained. However, as of September 12, \$124,450 had been spent and there are still families who need financial assistance. Please consider donating to the Immigrant Family Defense Fund (immigrantfamilies.org). For more information, please visit freedomforimmigrants.org.
- **3) Friends Afuera:** Join this group to write letters to someone in ICE detention. Letters can do wonders to boost the morale of a detainee. You will be asked to deposit a modest (\$15) amount to a commissary account once a month. For more information, email friendsafuera@im4humanintegrity.org
- 4) On Sunday, October 7th at 4:00 p.m. there will be a celebration of 7 years of Interfaith Presence at WCDF at Kehilla Community Synagogue, 1300 Grand Ave., Oakland. Join in a community celebration with people who have been freed and come home, and the *Joyful Noise Gospel Singers*, a nonprofit community choir dedicated to social justice and human rights (joyfulnoisegospelsingers.org).


