





#### Notes from Fr. Nick

#### All Souls—Purgatory


Friday was the Solemnity of All Souls, and since November is the month when we commemorate our deceased friends and family we might consider our Catholic belief in Purgatory.

Purgatory marks the commemoration of those who have died before they were fully reconciled to God's love. I have chosen my words very carefully here because it is almost impossible for us to deal with the concept of Purgatory without thinking of it as a place; more on this in a moment.

Our sense of justice makes us aware that if we die with minor offenses against God (*venial sins*) or without fully recognizing God's absolute and unconditional forgiveness (*penance*), there needs to be some resolution before we can fully enter God's presence. This process is called *purgation*—a final purging of our faults before we enter into Heaven. God is just; thus we cannot be fully in his presence with even the remnants of sin. However, God is also Love, and will not hold faults against us in eternity.

The Church has traditionally called this process *Purgatory*, and it came to be seen as a place, along with Heaven and Hell. The trouble is that places exist only in the material universe. If Heaven, Hell, and Purgatory are places, then we could get to them in a spaceship or some other human invention. Since they, like the Father, exist outside this world, it may be better to think of them as *states of being*. Heaven is total union with God. Hell is the absence of God, and Purgatory is the process by which we are purged of all traces of sin so that we can be in full union with God.

Should we pray for souls in Purgatory? Yes, because we continue to live in time and space. God, who is eternal, anticipates our concern for those who have passed form this life. In his infinite love, God allows our prayers to aid those in accepting Him fully as they enter Heaven.

## Voting with a Conscience — And as a Catholic

#### Bread for the World Campaign

Next weekend, look for our School of the Madeleine and parish volunteers at tables outside church doors. Stop by before or after Mass and join our parish "Offering of Letters" campaign: sign letters to your elected officials, urging them to restore funding and preserve programs that provide food to those in need. This is an annual event sponsored by <u>Bread for the World</u>, a collective Christian voice that advocates for policies and funding decisions to end hunger at home and abroad. Please also consider making a donation online at <u>www.bread.org</u>. Your contribution supports this important work.

#### Did you know?

- The cause of world hunger is not a shortage of food but rather access to food.
- ♦ Some countries have a "hunger season" of 3 to 4 months every year, when the previous harvest is gone and the next harvest is not yet ready.
- We don't have that kind of hunger season, but in 2017, 40 million people (11.8% of U.S. households) were food-insecure, meaning that they were unsure at some point during the year about how they would provide for their next meal.
- ♦ Even careful planning cannot stretch the grocery budget throughout the month for many. Less expensive and less nutritious filler foods can keep children's stomachs from growling, but don't provide what children need to grow and learn. Adults who are missing meals are not able to concentrate as well at work.
- Women are the primary agents the world relies on to end hunger. <u>If they had the same access as men</u> to tools, seeds, land titles, and financial services, then women could grow 30% more food.

- ◆ The Saint Junipero Serra Catechetical Institute, which is the program used for catechists to get certification as Catechist in California, according to the Guidelines of the California Bishops. The English branch of the Serra Catechetical Institute has been dormant for almost three years, and is reopening, thanks to the Dominican Friars and the group of Diocesan priests who have made themselves available to teach at the Institute. (The Spanish branch of the Serra Institute has been functioning very successfully, with an average of 50 students per year.)
- The Saint Francis de Sales School for Pastoral Ministries, which is committed in forming lay leaders to support parish pastoral efforts.




