

Social Justice Notes

Bread for the World Campaign

"But a country is not just what it does—it is also what it puts up with, what it tolerates."

- ~ *Kurt Tucholosky, a German writer of Jewish origin, 1935* Thank you to our parish members for **not** tolerating family separation, injustice, and hunger! Our community takes action:
- Bread for the World's Offering of Letters.

 Last weekend, parish members signed nearly 400 letters that were personally delivered to Senators Harris (123) and Feinstein (122), and to Congresspersons Barbara Lee (106) and Mark DeSaulnier (21). Students at School of the Madeleine also wrote letter, urging Congress to pass legislation to eliminate hunger here and abroad. Our School of the Madeleine students took a leadership role in making the annual letter campaign happen and succeed. *Kudos to them!*
- ♦ Casa Francisca. We provide ongoing support to refugees and asylum seekers who are guests at the Casa. Our parish contributes food and house supplies, and offers assistance navigating the "business of life," such as access to transportation, school enrollment, employment opportunities, etc.
- Accompaniment for immigrants. Our Refugee Aid Committee joins community faith groups (e.g., East Bay Interfaith Immigration Coalition and East Bay Sanctuary) to support the legal and social needs of local refugees and asylum seekers.

Why welcome the stranger? A refugee is "A person who owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion, is outside the country of his nationality and is unable or, owing to such fear, is unwilling to avail himself of the protection of that country; or who, not having a nationality and being outside the country of his former habitual residence as a result of such events, is unable or, owing to such fear, is unwilling to return to it." (Article I, 1951 Refugee Convention, amended 1967, United Nations multilateral treaty)

Bread for the World Update: Please consider extending our Offering of Letters by writing a personal appeal to our Congressional leaders, urging them to pass a budget that will reduce hunger here and abroad. 


