





Notes from Fr. Nick

A New Liturgical Year

On the Sunday after Thanksgiving we begin a new liturgical year. The Church's year doesn't correspond to the calendar year, because it is built around preparation and feasting.

The Rhythm of the Church Year. Each Church year begins with Advent, the preparation for the great Feast of the Incarnation—Christmas. After Christmas season ends with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord in January, a few weeks pass where we return to Ordinary Time before the second preparation begins: Lent. Lent prepares us spiritually for the Feast of the Resurrection—Easter. The Easter celebration continues until the end of Pentecost week. There follows another period of Ordinary Time which lasts for several months, until Advent begins again at the end of November or beginning of December.



Since the Second Vatican Council, each new year also begins a new cycle of Sunday readings from the Scriptures. There are three cycles that roughly correspond to the four Gospels. The first cycle contains mostly readings from the Gospel of Matthew. Cycle B, the one we concluded last month, is mostly taken from the Gospel of Mark. (But since Mark is so short, in the summer it is supplemented with readings from John.) We are beginning Cycle C today, the first Sunday of Advent. Cycle C takes most of its Gospel readings from Luke.

The Cycle of Saints. In addition to the seasons of preparations for and celebrations of Christmas and Advent, the Church follows another cycle each year: the feasts of Saints. A saint's feast is usually connected with the day of his or her death. This may seem odd or

macabre, but from the perspective of heaven, the date of our death is the day we enter Paradise. Saints' feasts come in four categories: **Optional Memorials**, which are usually celebrated in the geographical locations near where the saint lived; **Obligatory Memorials**, celebrated by the entire Church; **Feasts**, more important celebrations for the entire Church; and **Solemnities**, which even supplant the prayers at a

Sunday Mass.

As we begin our new Church year, it might be a good time to sit down and read through the Gospel of Luke. If we only hear the Gospels on Sunday, we miss the bigger picture the Evangelist was trying to impart. It will also help us understand how all the Gospel stories we hear on Sunday fit together.



Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the Church after the 5:30 pm Mass (starting at approximately 6:10 pm) on the three Fridays of Advent:

December 7th, 14th & 21st. Please join us on at least one of these evenings for this sacred time of prayer and meditation with our Lord.




