



Notes from Fr. Nick

Saints Elizabeth Ann Seton & John Neumann

Although we are celebrating the feast of the Epiphany today, two saints' feasts took place this past week that deserve our attention. January 4th is the feast of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton and John Neumann's feast is January 5th. Both ministered in the United States, and Saint Elizabeth is the first American-born saint.



Saint Elizabeth was born Elizabeth Ann Bayley to a socially-prominent New York City couple in 1774, while our country was still a colony, and became a devout member of the Church of England. At age 19, she was married to a wealthy businessman, William Seton. At first, their marriage was extraordinarily happy, and they had five children. After Will's health deteriorated and his business failed, the family journeyed to Italy in the hope that the peninsula's sunny weather would improve his health. However, Will soon died of tuberculosis, leaving Elizabeth nearly penniless and away from her homeland.

While in Italy, she was introduced to the Catholic faith through her husband's former business partners, and upon returning to this country, was accepted into the only Catholic church existing in New York City at that time: St. Peter's. She then opened an academy for schoolgirls, but when it became known that she was a Catholic, most parents withdrew their daughters from it.


She subsequently accepted the offer of some French Sulpician Fathers

to open a school in Emmitsburg, Maryland, and in 1810 she established **Saint Joseph's Academy and Free School**, the first free Catholic School in the U.S. The same year, she and two other women organized the first religious order founded in the United States, the **Sisters of Charity**, patterned after the teachings of Saint Vincent de Paul and the Daughters of Charity in France. Having lost her own mother at an early age, Elizabeth had a particular devotion to the Blessed Mother, whom she regarded as her spiritual mother. She was also devoted to the Eucharist and to Sacred Scripture, particularly the 23rd Psalm. "Mother Seton," as she was known, died (also of tuberculosis) in 1821 at age 46, and was canonized on September 14th, 1975.

Saint John Neumann suffered many setbacks in his life, yet tenaciously worked to build up the faith wherever he found himself. Born in 1811 in Bohemia (part of the modern Czech Republic), Neumann expected

to be ordained a priest in 1835, but due to a surfeit of priests in his diocese, his bishop cancelled all ordinations. Neumann thereupon left for America with only \$1 in his pocket, and was ordained by the bishop of New York three weeks after his arrival. He was first assigned to a large parish in the Niagara Falls area to work among German immigrants.

His isolation made him yearn to join a religious order, and in 1842 Neumann took vows as a Redemptorist Father. He was the first candidate of that community in the New World. In 1852 he was ordained Bishop of Philadelphia, where he became the first bishop in the U.S. to establish a diocesan school system. He also built orphanages and opened parishes, building new churches at the rate of nearly one per month.



Bishop Neumann fought against the Know-Nothings, a group who sought to expel foreigners and Catholics from the country. He died of a stroke at age 48, on January 5th, 1860, and was canonized on June 19th, 1977.









