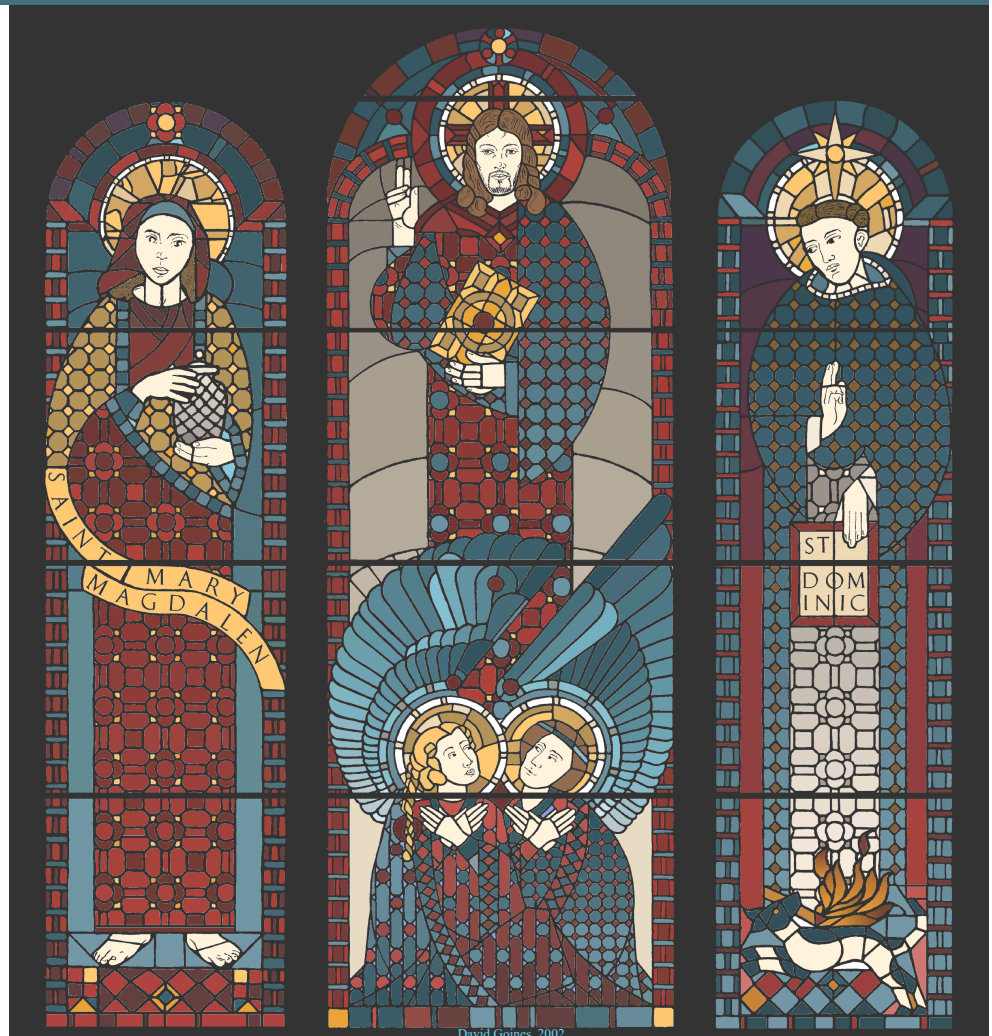

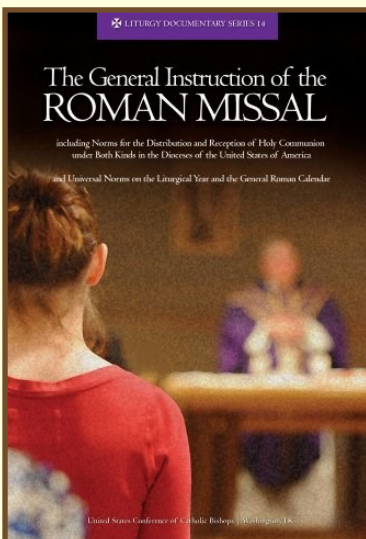
## Notes from Fr. Nick

# The Triduum

The word *Triduum* reentered the Church's vocabulary after the Second Vatican Council, but it actually names one of our most ancient celebrations. Both **Saint Cyril of Jerusalem** and **Egeria** (a Spanish nun) attest to these rites in Jerusalem around the year 380. *The rituals of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday were considered one liturgy, and receiving new Christians into the Church was central to their celebration.*

The Mass of the Lord's Supper celebrated on Holy Thursday evening commemorated Jesus' last supper and began an observance so strict that Eucharist would not be celebrated Saturday evening. This is the 8<sup>th</sup>-century origin of the procession of the Eucharist out of the main church to another chapel. This is also the Mass in which we follow Jesus' command to serve one another, expressed by washing feet. (John 13:1-11)

Good Friday rituals combine four celebrations: **Proclamation of the Passion, Prayers for the Church and World, Reverencing the Cross**, and a **Communion Service**. Eucharist is not celebrated in commemoration of Christ's death.



The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* calls the Easter Vigil "*the mother of all vigils.*" (GRIM 21) In the time of Saint Cyril, the Jerusalemites would spend the night in a vigil of prayer, proclaiming the scriptures and singing and praying for those being baptized. At the same time, new Christians — still in the baptistery at this point — would be immersed in the pool and anointed. Afterward, the newly baptized would join the faithful inside the church and receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Our Triduum liturgy is ancient, long, and quirky. If you expect it to follow a logical progression, or be entertaining, you might be a little disconcerted. But, if you allow yourself to let the Holy Spirit take you into its own logic, you will be deeply affected.

*Take the time to participate in the whole Triduum — go with the flow — and I guarantee that you will be moved to a deeper faith.*

## Peace & Social Justice

*"I was hungry and you fed me; I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you welcomed me. ... Insofar as you did these things for the least of my brothers and sisters, you did them for me." (Matthew 25:36)*

*Catholic Charities of the East Bay* is closing their refugee resettlement office. They cannot afford to stay in business as a result of the dramatically low numbers of individuals being allowed to emigrate to the U.S. The resettlement office has been in existence since 1975 when 150,000 refugees arrived in the U.S. Another 200,000 came in 1980. By contrast, 22,491 came in 2018 and just 9,000 so far in 2019.

The closure terminates the *Family to Family* program, which assisted families in conjunction with sponsoring parishes, such as St. Mary Magdalen. The CCEB legal department is still operating and can help with green card application, citizenship, etc., but will no longer meet immigrants on arrival and serve them for 90 days as in the past. *Immigration's root causes* include violence and poverty in one's home country, but President Trump has called for an end of foreign aid to Guatemala, El Salvador and Honduras. Please join the **Ignatian Solidarity Network** and the **Jesuit Conference Office of Justice and Ecology** in protest against this policy.

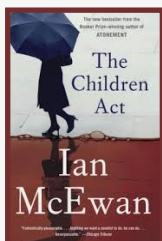

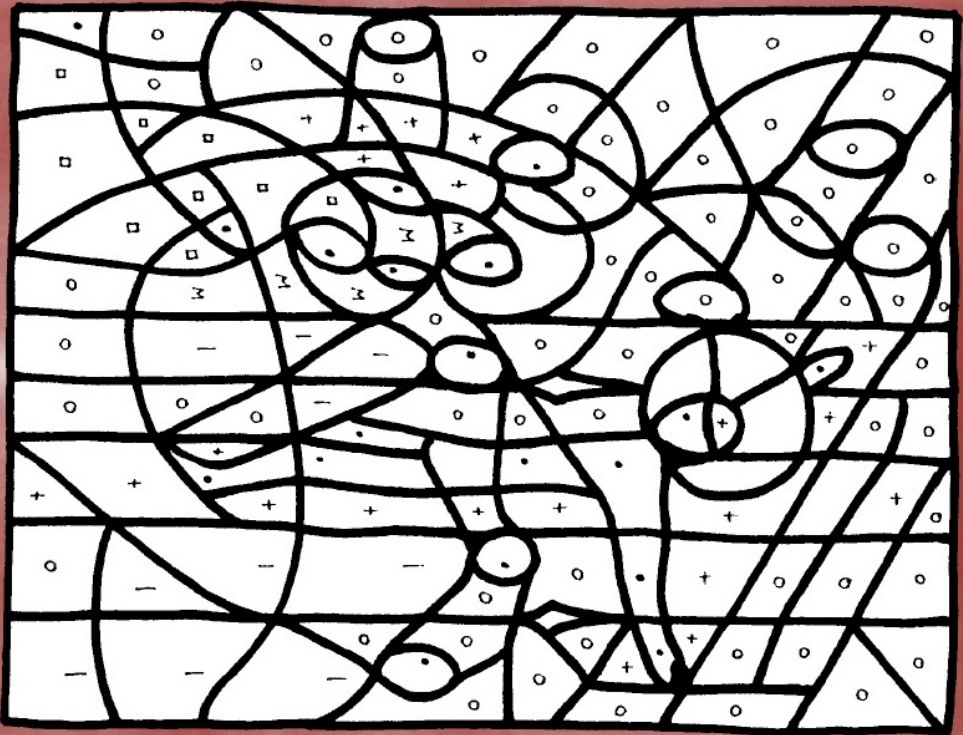
