



Notes from Fr. Nick

Happy Easter!

When I was a child, one of the happily anticipated events of summer was my first swim. After school let out in June, my family would climb into our Oldsmobile and journey to our summer place at Salt Springs. Florida summers are humid, and by the time we had unpacked our things and walked down to the spring we were hot and sticky. My younger brothers would run down the embankment and wade in without slowing down. On the other hand, my own eagerness was tempered with just a touch of anxiety. All during the winter I had awaited the delicious buoyancy of the spring, but the water was cold and I dreaded the shock just a little.

Life is like plunging into the spring. We want to get on with it, but often dread the process. Whether it is a test before graduation, packing before a big move, or having a hip replaced, we look forward to the outcome, but are apprehensive about the process of reaching it. As Jesus' passion and

death led to his resurrection, our Lent has lead us to Easter. For me this year, Lent has meant gearing up for our parish renewal, planning Holy Week and accomplishing largely unfulfilled Lenten resolutions. Nevertheless, I'm ready for the plunge into Easter bliss. Do I feel a tinge of anxiety? Yes! But Christ extends his arms of salvation, even if I don't feel quite ready.

If it wasn't, take heart. Christ still extends his saving arms and offers you the rest of your life to take the plunge.

Peace & Social Justice

IMPORTANT: Pending California Legislation Relating to private prisons/background: Many states and communities are re-thinking contracts with private prisons. According to a Inspector General report, *Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)* failed to take action against detention facilities contracted by *ICE* after discovering thousands of violations jeopardizing detainees' safety.

<u>AB 32</u> - This bill would prohibit the *California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR)* from entering into or renewing a contract with a private, for-profit prison to incarcerate state prison inmates. The bill would also prohibit, after January 1, 2028, a state prison inmate or other person under the jurisdiction of the department from being incarcerated in a private, for-profit prison facility.

<u>AB 1282</u> (No Private ICE Act): This bill "prohibit[s] the *California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR)* from facilitating or allowing private security guards to detain, take custody of, or arrest individuals for immigration enforcement purposes." The Bill was introduced to address ICE's increasing reliance on private contractors and their use to make immigration arrests, which violates the federal *Immigration and Nationality Act (INA)*.

Pending Legislation Relating to the Environment: AB 1080: This bill would phase out the single-use plastics by 2030, addressing concerns about plastic debris going in oceans and on beaches. Also, China, once a major importer of our plastic waste, stopped accepting it in 2018.

<u>Get involved and take action!</u> Write, call, or email your representatives in the State Assembly and urge them to support these bills.

This interfaith event connected potential volunteers to opportunities to serve. 
Passion (Palm) Sunday at St. Mary Magdalen


