Notes from Fr. Nick

What is Self? [A Challenging Book]



Bernadette Roberts, What is Self? A Study of the Spiritual Journey in Terms of Consciousness. Boulder, CO: Sentient Publications, 2005. Bernadette Roberts is a former Carmelite nun who writes about contemplative prayer. In *What is Self?* Roberts explores the three states of prayer espoused by mystics over the centuries: *purgative, illuminative* and *unitive. Purgative prayer* seeks to eliminate any encumbrances to one's relationship with God; renunciation of evil, avoiding temptation, and ordering one's life toward God's grace. *Illuminative prayer* seeks a deeper understanding of God's presence in one's life. In the *unitive* state, the ego falls away and one experiences the direct presence of God. Although this last state can be accompanied by a sense of ecstasy, in a nuanced sense, the very experience of bliss is a stepping back from true union.

Roberts proposes an additional state en route to true union with God. She believes that, beyond the loss of the ego—one's identity, standing apart from the rest of creation—there must also be a "falling away" of the self before true union with the Godhead can occur. In this state there would no longer be any selfawareness, only the eternal happiness of being integrated into the Godhead.

Much of *What is Self?* explores Christ's nature. On the human side, Roberts believes the second person in the Blessed Trinity so completely entered into the human state that he wasn't aware of his divinity during his human life. Following the will of the Father was truly an act of faith. He so thoroughly became

human that his death may be seen as the death of God—his rising, God's rising, to new life.

On the divine side, Roberts talks of the Father as the un-manifest essence of God. The Manifest presence of God is Christ — He is the *raison d'être* for creation [my words]. Jesus is the manifestation of the un-manifest Godhead. The Paschal Mystery is that manifestation in motion [my words again]. She believes that we don't pay enough attention to the Ascension, but that it is the necessary completion of this movement of the Godhead. Eucharist is, therefore, the divine manifestation of the Christ in time and space.

Roberts's book helped me with an understanding of life after death. Most of us assume that heaven will be like this world, but improved. Other than the promise that we will be perfectly happy, there is little to support this notion in Scripture or Church teaching. On the other hand, if we give up life as we know it—even self-awareness—for something even better, what's wrong with that?

While I have some concerns with some of Roberts' ideas, my issues with her writing might be muted if she had more thoroughly hashed them out. Nevertheless, *What is Self*? is a rewarding — if challenging and complex — work to read. It bears more study than just a simple read-through. Areas where she and Church teaching may diverge can be compared to the nascent work of Freud in relation to later psychiatric theory. Roberts' work could open the door for 21st-century skeptics who have difficulty with popular notions of heaven, or that God interacts with each of us personally. If they yearn for a sense of life beyond measurable and verifiable scientific and critical thought, *What is Self*? may help them on their journey.

Peace & Social Justice

Monthly Vigils at the San Francisco Immigration **Court:** The April vigil, led by Berkeley's *Temple* Beth-El, focused on family separation and migrant children. Some background: The Administration is still trying to circumvent or end the Flores Law, which limits the amount of time children can be detained to 20 days. As of October 2018, however, the average detention time was 59 days. While the number of unaccompanied minors remained steady through 2018, per U.S. Customs and Border Patrol data (Southwest Border Migration FY2019), the number of children in custody of the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) steadily increased, largely due to Administration policy changes that significantly reduced the number of sponsors able to take these children. Fortunately, in December 2018, over 4,000 children were released to their families! Pending California Legislation

Please write, call or email your California representatives in the State Assembly or Senate in support of these pending bills. Find details about each bill at <u>leginfo.legislature.ca.gov.</u>

<u>AB 32</u> – A prohibition on State contracts with private, for-profit prisons, and after January 1, 2028, a prohibition on the incarceration of inmates or other persons in a private, for-profit prison facility.

<u>AB 1282</u> (No Private ICE Act): A prohibition on using private security guards to detain, take custody of, or arrest individuals for immigration enforcement purposes. The Bill was introduced to address ICE's increasing reliance on private contractors to make immigration arrests, which violates the federal *Immigration and Nationality Act (INA)*.

<u>AB 1080</u>: a prohibition on single-use plastics by the year 2030.
