



Our guests appreciate your delicious desserts! Please drop them off in the Parish Hall before 1:00 pm.





Notes from Fr. Nick

James Thomas Glisson, Jr., Requiescat in Pace



My father, James T. Glisson, Jr., died on Thursday, April 25th, after a long decline. He was 92. Dad was born near his childhood home in Cross Creek, Florida, on March 15, 1927. While he was a world traveler, he lived near Cross Creek all his life. As a child, his club feet were corrected at the Shriner's Hospital in Greenville, South Carolina, over a period of nine years. Later he was agile enough to enter the United States Army Air Corps during WWII. Dad was an avid pilot and sailor all his life.

Following service and prompted by his neighbor, friend and Pulitzer Prize winning novelist, Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings, my father pursued a career as a artist. He branched out many times from this profession, but art was always at the center of what he did: banking, advertising, manufactured houses, and consulting in Mexico, Argentina, and Germany. He also wrote two books and a play.

Although he later adopted the Catholic faith of his family, Dad remained a life-long member of the Masonic Lodge in gratitude for their generosity in straightening his feet so he could walk. He worked with local lodges and was benefactor to their hospital in Greenville.

James T. ("JT") Glisson married Patricia Apone on September 20, 1950, and had five children. He is survived by his wife of 67 years; sons Nicholas; J. Thomas, III; Steven; and daughter, Jeannie Glisson-Cruthers. My brother Will died three years ago. Dad had three grandchildren: James Thomas, IV; Nathaniel; and Fiona.

Funeral plans are pending. Likely in a couple of weeks, after we receive his cremains, my family will meet in Florida, where I will celebrate Dad's funeral at Holy Faith Church in Gainesville. He will be buried in our family plot in Citra, Florida.

Dad was always a demanding person who often could be combative. These tendencies may have served him well in business and in creative work, but unfortunately, as his dementia progressed, my family and I had to make decisions for his welfare that he did not like. This put a serious emotional strain on us in the last several months.

To me, caring for my father brought to light the challenge of living out the Fourth Commandment: "Honor your father and mother." Most of my life I had assumed that this commandment was directed at children being obedient to their parents. In the last few months I've realized that the real import of the Fourth Commandment is respecting one's aging parent while seeing primarily to their welfare. Doing this prayerfully while having to say "no" to my father's wishes was a moral dilemma with no happy resolution. While I don't regret my decisions, I will never feel completely at ease with some of the choices I had to make.

I hope my long-term memories of Dad will be of a man who took us on adventures most people are only able to watch on television. He taught us to draw, paint and sculpt well enough that two of my brothers made it their careers, and he gave us a sense of responsibility for the greater good and a practice of our faith with a critical and committed conscience.


