



Notes from Fr. Nick

Motherhood

Motherhood is something completely outside my sphere of imagination. The idea of another human being taking shape inside me and coming out as an independent person is so far-fetched that it exceeds my ability to comprehend it. Yet this is such second nature to women that I believe some of them give the concept scarcely a thought. It may be worthwhile for us men to consider this miracle. After all, many of you have a definite role in it coming about!

Scientists have long speculated why biological evolution took the course it did. It would have been much more efficient and logical for cells to continue multiplying and dividing, or producing clones like lower species and some plants do. But, for some reason, life went along the path of opposite sexes and, inevitably, intercourse. I like to think this is where God enters the picture. God chose to give this act of creation a measure of the joy he feels in causing the universe to come into being. Conception is one of God's ways to allow human beings to experience his joy.

After the bliss of conception, it seems that women are left with most of the hard part. Not only do they have to bear us in their wombs, but they must nurture and care for us until we are able to get along on our own. This part of mother-hood may be the most difficult for me to understand: while mothers suffer the pain and difficulty of raising children they also experience a peace and satisfaction from seeing their children mature that I can never really appreciate. Perhaps this is why the bond between mother and child is stronger than just about anything else on earth.

As we celebrate Mother's Day, all of us should consider the significance of motherhood. It is not just the miracle of birth, but the whole process of shepherding a person into adulthood that makes the act of mothering one of the great miracles of human life.

Peace & Social Justice

The pending bill, American Dream and Promise Act of 2019 (H.R. 6), provides a pathway to citizenship for Dreamers, including those who are part of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program, as well as individuals with Temporary Protected Status and Deferred Enforced Departure status. These community members are employed, tax-paying, socially contributing individuals who have built lives in the United States. HR 6 will ensure that they can stay with their families and continue to contribute to our country.

The Jesuit Conference Office of Justice and Ecology, Ignatian Solidarity Network, and Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities have made it easy to urge your Congressional Representative to pass this bill, which should soon leave the House Judiciary Committee for action in the House. Please act today to let Congress know the importance of moving this legislation toward enactment. Go to www.ignatiansolidarity.net, click on "ADVOCACY" and find "Call for passage of the Dream and Promise Act" to submit an online letter.

Monday, May 20th: Immigrant Day at the State Capitol in Sacramento, organized by California Immigrant Policy Center (CIPC). This annual event lobbies for state bills that are inclusive and uphold the well-being of immigrants in California. This year, they will advocate for AB 1282 and AB1332 (erroneously reported as AB 32 in the April 21 and 28 Bulletins; see below for more information). The Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity (IM4HI), one of several organizations that the Refugee Aid Committee works with and supports, will send a delegation. <u>AB 1282</u> (No Private ICE Act): A prohibition on the use of private security guards to detain, take custody of, or arrest individuals for immigration enforcement purposes. The Bill was introduced to address ICE's increasing reliance on private contractors and their use to make immigration arrests, which violates the federal *Immigration and Nationality Act* (the *INA*).

<u>AB 1332</u>: A prohibition on State contracts with private, for-profit prisons, and after January 1, 2028, a prohibition on the incarceration of inmates or other persons in a private, for-profit prison facility.


