



Notes from Fr. Nick

The Birth of John the Baptist

Only six more months until Christmas! That's the reason that the Solemnity of the Birth of John the Baptist falls on June 24th. According to the Gospel of Luke, John was six months older than Jesus.



In the Gospel for this feast, an angel tells Zechariah, John the Baptist's father, that his son will prepare the way for the Lord. To an elderly man who thought he would die without children, these were auspicious words. The announcement is, therefore, marked by both the great joy at the miracle of a child being born to elderly parents, but also of foreboding because the child has been singled out for a special task.

To one degree or another, I suspect that all parents have similar thoughts as they await the birth of their child.

They imagine all the potential that lies within their baby, and yet they also have fears about the dangers he or she will face.

We all know the rest of John's story. Measured in human terms, his life could be seen as a disaster. He did not live a conventional existence, he spent much of his life in a passionate call for reform, and he died a senseless death. But from another perspective, John the Baptist's life was triumphant: he announced the coming Messiah, he was the last and greatest prophet, and he was martyred.

Sometimes it's easy to judge other people's lives only from an external perspective. Their lifestyle may be unconventional; they don't seem to contribute anything material to the world; and they die in anonymity. But, from God's perspective their lives may be completely different. As we celebrate John the Baptist's birth, we should take a look at our lives from God's point of view. Have we lived according to His will? In the end, that's all that matters.

Summer is our leanest time for volunteers. If you have spare time this weekend, please consider helping us at <u>today's Dinner for the Poor and Home-</u>less. Besides serving those in need, it's a great way to meet fellow parishioners.

Temporary Protected Status Update

Several pending court cases (*Saget v. Trump*, *Bhattarai v. Nielsen*, and *Ramos v. Nielsen*) have resulted in a temporary freeze on the Administration's plan to terminate **Temporary Protected Status** (TPS) for immigrants from Haiti, Nepal and Honduras who are currently in the United States under this program, and would be removed from the U.S. as a result. The freeze also protects TPS beneficiaries from Sudan, El Salvador and Nicaragua. TPS provides that qualifying individuals may live and work in the United States.

Congress created the **Temporary Protected Status** in the *Immigration Act of 1990.* It is defined as a "temporary immigration status provided to nationals of specifically-designated countries that are confronting an ongoing armed conflict, environmental disaster, or extraordinary and temporary conditions."


