

Notes from Fr. Nick

Parish Renewal & Adult Sunday School

Since last October we have talked about parish renewal. This project began when our staff and I attended the diocesan priests' convocation led by Fr. James Mallon. Some other parishes have already begun this process, but I wanted to be sure that we get it right, and so we're being deliberate. Earlier this year we assembled a Renewal Committee, which is chaired by parishioner Claire Broome. More recently I asked Deacon Jeff Burns to assist in their deliberations and planning.

After much debate, the Renewal Committee chose the **Renew Program** as the main vehicle for our rejuvenation. We decided that Renew's Lectionary-based program (Scripture readings from Sunday Mass) best serves our community. Many longtime parishioners will recall that the Renew program worked very well in our parish starting in the late 1990s — one of our Renew groups lasted through 2017. Soon we'll be asking you to join a small Renew group to share your reflections on Scripture and what it means in your life.

In addition, once the new audiovisual equipment is installed in the church, we'll begin **Adult Sunday School** between the 9:30 am and the (newly moved) 11:30 am Masses. While sharing our faith experiences is central to deepening our relationship with God, it is also important for us to understand what our Church teaches. Starting on October 13th, I'll be leading short classes based on the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. They will begin around 10:40 am in the church, and will last about 10-15 minutes, with discussion continued downstairs during Coffee Hour in Norton Hall.

These Adult Sunday School classes will give us a common vocabulary to discuss the role of faith in our lives. We're entering new territory with these presentations, and so we hope you'll be patient while we work out how they are best presented.

This coming week our staff and Renewal Committee will be away for a retreat all day Tuesday and Wednesday (August 27th & 28th) and the parish office will be closed. All of us want to be up to speed on the Renew process, and therefore we are taking this time for a "crash course" in the Renew Program so that we can best implement it here in our parish.

Please keep the Parish Staff and our Renewal Committee in your prayers this week. We want the renewal of our parish to be something that truly energizes our community for years to come.

A Warm Welcome to Fr. W.E. Ngema, Our New Priest-in-Residence



Our senior priest-in-residence, **Fr. Ioane Ono**, has been called back home to Samoa for the remainder of this year, but God has graced our parish with the presence of **Fr. W.E. Ngema**, who arrived in the U.S. for the very first time just ten days ago. Fr. Ngema (as he likes to be called) is enrolled in the doctoral program at the Jesuit School of Theology, where he will study for five or six years before returning to his diocese in the Southwest (English-speaking) Region of Cameroon. A priest for nearly ten years, Fr. Ngema has been a founding pastor

of two different parishes, and he has also enjoyed a rich and long editorial experience, most recently as the editor of the monthly journal of the Catholic bishops of his country, *Cameroon Panorama*. We eagerly await the reception of his faculties in our diocese so that Fr. Ngema can celebrate Mass and the sacraments with us.

Letter of Gratitude from Fr. Joseph Kamoga

"I am writing to thank the parishioners of St. Mary Magdalen parish for opening their hearts to funding a new water supply for the schools of my parish in the



Diocese of Masaka, Uganda. The original estimated cost was \$2100, but when water and borehole engineers did a survey, they found water 90 feet

down, not at 60 feet, as we had earlier anticipated. This means that we will need 50% more corrugated stainless steel pipes and waterproof cement, and that raised the cost to \$2,900.

"Thankfully we have received enough money from your wonderful good-willed parishioners to enable us to make two good boreholes. Boreholes will be drilled at St Charles Lwanga Kabendera Primary School [pictured above] and at St Kizito Secondary School.

"Work on the project started last week and will take a period of six to eight weeks. Upon completion of these borehole projects, I will send reports and photos and letters from the administration of these two schools to you so that your parishioners can see what their money did—that is, availing access of clean water to vulnerable schoolchildren."

<u>Refugee Aid Committee Update:</u> We continue to support Casa Francisca, which provides housing for refugees and asylum seekers, and the Committee donated baby clothes and diapers to an expectant immigrant mother living there.

In June our parish contributed six carloads of usable items to a truck travelling to the *McAllen Respite Center* (organized by Bay Area Border Relief). There will be no truck in September. Instead, BABR has identified other ways that we can support the McAllen Respite Center and immigrants at the border, and the Committee will soon be sharing that information with the parish.

Although California's last execution took place on January 17, 2006, capital punishment is still legal in our state. Attorney General Barr has also ordered that capital punishment resume for federal crimes; he has scheduled five federal inmates for execution in December 2019-January 2020. 
