

Notes from Fr. Nick

The Organization of the Roman Catholic Church

Organization and rank in the makeup of the Catholic Church is rather complicated. No one designed the Church's configuration at the beginning. Rather, it developed more or less *ad hoc* and there are more than a few anomalies. Nevertheless, it has served the Church, nearly unchanged, for more than 1500 years. This structure varies a little from one part of the world to another, and sometimes the names of Church departments and the titles of its officers differ, but it's a remarkably efficient institution. I'll just try to scratch the surface here.

The primary office in the Church is bishop. In the earliest Church, those from communities of Jewish origin called their sacramental leaders *presbyters*; those of Greek background were called *episcopos*. As the Church grew, these leaders appointed assistants who could celebrate the sacraments with outlying communities. Today's bishops trace their ancestry to *presbyters* and *episcopos*. Priests trace their heritage from these assistants of ancient bishops.

The Roman Empire provided the pattern for the Church's geographical order. Each Roman province was carved up into *dioceses* (the word means "a division of ten"), and the Church followed suit. Bishops were in charge of major cities (or market towns) and the surrounding territory, with priests assisting the bishop. A bishop in charge of a diocese is also called *the Ordinary*.

Over time, the largest cities were named *archdioceses*, and its bishops, *archbishops*. These archbishops often have assistant or auxiliary bishops, who exercise more authority than do priests. However, the only authority an archbishop exercises outside his archdiocese is to arbitrate disputes between dioceses within his province. (Note: since the Pope regularly awards the title of "archbishop" to those who work in Roman offices, the term "Metropolitan Archbishop" distinguishes those who preside over archdioceses.)

Most dioceses are subdivided into smaller units or clusters of parishes called *deaneries*, which are supervised by a *Dean*. It is the Dean's responsibility to make sure the sacramental books of parishes in the deanery are in order. He can also call meetings of pastors to coordinate ministries. For example, in our Berkeley deanery our dean is Fr. Ken Nobrega of Saint Joseph the Worker Parish.

The number two position under a Bishop is the *Vicar General*, who often functions in the bishop's absence and carries out the bishop's policies. He and the bishop work with a small group of priests appointed by the bishop, called *Consulters*. In addition, there is an elected *Presbyterial Council* representing the priests of the diocese.

The diocesan offices are called the *Chancery*. It consists of the various ministries and business functions of the diocese and is presided over by the *Chancellor*. The Chancellor need not be a priest or bishop, and ours is a layperson, Stephen A. Wilcox. An important office within the Chancery is the Tribunal which is well known, as it handles matters of Church or "Canon" law, including the granting of marriage annulments.


