



Adoration will take place tomorrow (December 2nd) and on all the subsequent Mondays of Advent, immediately after the 5:30 pm Mass (approximately 6:05 pm). The people who come to this hour of prayer do so to find some quiet time to be with God, to discern the movement of God in their lives, and to dive more deeply into building a relationship with the divine.

New Trump Administration Policy Sets a Dismal Historical Record

For the first time in American history, large numbers of refugees can now be returned to a third country without their consent. Under the so-called *'Safe Third Country'* policy, asylum seekers from El Salvador and Honduras may now be sent to Guatemala for processing rather than be allowed to seek protection at our southern border.

The *United Nations High Commission on Refugees* has expressed "serious concerns" about this agreement between the U.S. and Guatemala, and *Department of Homeland Security* officials privately stated that Guatemala is not equipped to take in refugees. The humanitarian crisis is being pushed out of our sight, but we cannot let it be forgotten. As the U.S. Council of Catholic Bishops reminds us: "Rather than turn away the vulnerable, we must answer the call to act with compassion towards those in need ..."

<u>Bread for the World</u>: Consider picking up an envelope in the vestibule of the church and becoming a member. Or visit <u>bread.org</u>. Members receive a quarterly newsletter explaining what our government does to alleviate hunger. *Bread for the World* is <u>not</u> a charity, but a highly effective lobbying organization for legislation and policies to reduce hunger at home and abroad.


