

Happy New Year!

Nothing can completely prepare us for what is to come, and life would be rather boring if we could. Nevertheless, there are some obvious ways we can be prayerfully ready for what this new year presents:

Maintain contact with your community. If you come to church but remain mentally and spiritually in your own space, you'll be missing a primary way that God communicates with us. The Church is worthy of its name when we worship together. Beyond this, knowing other people and relying on them helps us to confront the challenges life presents us, as well as to enhance our appreciation of its joys.

Have a sense of humor. As far as we know, human beings are the only species that truly laughs. Beyond allowing us to cope with uncomfortable or even impossible situations, humor helps us see the irony in life and to deal with it creatively. Too often we believe that Church should be 'serious'. Instead, we should relax and be amused at ourselves whenever we are caught in the act of being human. I suspect that God laughs a lot more than we do!

May God's blessings be upon you and all your endeavors in the coming year.

Embrace surprises. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus tells the story of a bridegroom who invited guests to a wedding and nobody would come. Rather than cancelling his plans, he went out into the 'bad part of town' and invited everybody. The poor and rejected had no other plans, and so they celebrated with him. (22:1-14) How often do we refuse an invitation just because it would shake us out of our routine? Sometimes there is a legitimate reason for saying "no," but all too often we miss out on wonderful opportunities because we refuse to seize the moment.

Supreme Court Halts Capital Punishment for

Federal Prisoners: The Supreme Court intervened and halted the December-January executions Attorney General Barr had ordered in July. Federal executions were stopped 16 years ago, but the Trump Administration has wanted to resume the practice. There are pending legal fights, and the Administration may still prevail in reinstituting the death penalty for federal prisoners, but the scheduled executions were not carried out because of the Supreme Court action. In 2018, Pope Francis updated the *Catholic Catechism* to read:

"The death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person," and the Church "works with determination for its abolition worldwide."


