





### Notes from Fr. Nick

### The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.



In many ways Martin Luther King has become a modern saint. His courage, eloquence, organizational skills and not least, his faith, moved the civil rights cause ahead at a pace few would have predicted in the years following the Second World War.


Yet, because many people who knew Reverend King personally (or knew of him through his reputation) are still alive, we are also conscious that he was a human being, with the limitations we all share. Martin Luther King had an ego. His family, friends and coworkers will tell you there were times when the great leader could be difficult to be around.

For me, Reverend King's foibles and idiosyncrasies do not detract from his greatness. Rather, these very traits remind me

that sainthood is not about being perfect, but about striving


for perfection. Every saint who ever lived possessed a fully-rounded personality that included bugs and annoyances that occasionally may have made them difficult to live with. However, sometimes these were the very traits that made them great.

As saints fade from living memory, it is easy to forget about the irritating features of their characters. Many of the personality traits of long-ago saints are not even known to us. When we lose sight of a saint's humanity, however, we run the risk of limiting his or her effectiveness as an example for our lives. We forget that all saints struggled with faults, just like the rest of us, and yet they still managed to live holy lives in spite of their faults. This quality is what set apart Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and all the rest of the saints in our lives.

### Mexicali Mission Luncheon

### Peace & Justice

Casa Francisca Update – Our parish supports Casa Francisca, a home founded in 1986 to provide temporary housing and support for refugees and asylum seekers in our community. They just relayed wonderful news: two Casa guests were granted asylum, and another (with residency) is now applying to transfer to a UC campus after working hard to complete high school and community college here! Members of our Peace & Justice/Refugee Aid Committee regularly liaise with Casa guests and staff.

Kudos – Thank you to School of the Madeline Staff, who partnered with the Peace and Justice Committee to provide Christmas baskets to the local immigrant families we work with. The generous support from school staff enabled our Committee to provide more gifts this year. We hope to continue this terrific joint partnership in the future, but in the meantime, a big 'thank you' to the staff!

U.S. Census and a sense of urgency - The upcoming 2020 census in April gathers critical data that determine Congressional representation (how many districts, how many seats) and provide demographic information for resource allocation to each state. The 2020 Census is particularly important to California, as out-of-state migration means we will most likely lose Congressional seats for the first time ever. Two populations will be hard to count: our immigrant communities (fearful because of Trump policies) and the estimated 151,000 homeless population. Reaching all communities will ensure that California receives its just due for all funds, services and representation based on state population. See 2020census.gov, and be sure to fill out your own census form!

<u>Just Mercy</u> and criminal justice. - The *Committee* recommends that you read or see *Just Mercy*, the true story of author Bryan Stevenson's defense of Walter McMillian, an African-American wrongfully sentenced to death. Read the book or see the recently released movie starring Jamie Foxx!

Bryan Stevenson is the founder of the *Equal Justice Initiative*, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need: the poor and the wrongly condemned. More info: justimercy.eji.org/.



### The Berkeley Food Pantry Marks 50 Years

On October 6th, the Berkeley Food Pantry officially celebrated 50 years of providing emergency groceries to our neighbors. They reflected on the fact that one person, Dorothy Noble, felt called to help local families in need and mobilized her friends, professionals, and the faith community to open the first emergency food pantry in Berkeley.

As we look back 50 years, we give thanks to all of our previous directors, volunteers, and supporters, as well as our current. We have helped many people and we are grateful to all of our supporters because we could not run this operation without them. Today, the Alameda County Community Food Bank estimates that 1 in 5 Alameda County residents live in food insecurity. Despite the historically low unemployment rate and our limited resources, the Berkeley Food Pantry continues to serve around 1,700 Berkeley and Albany residents a month.

The Food Pantry hopes that 50 years from now food pantries will exist only in history books.

Earlier this month St. Mary Magdalen parish delivered **375 pounds of food** you donated to the 1st Sunday Pantry Collection. We are one of their most reliable donors, and they are very grateful for our support.
