

Notes from Fr. Nick

### **Active Worship**

Until the coronavirus is stopped, one of the primary tenets of the Second Vatican Council is in jeopardy. *The Constitution on Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum concilium* 14) states: "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people' (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism."

Implementing this directive, the *General Instruction on the Roman Missal* outlines how the laity are to participate in liturgy. It states that the role of the community at Mass is to listen attentively to the readings and prayers, respond to greetings, and to sing the hymns and the parts of the Mass allotted to them. It also directs the faithful to participate in the liturgical ministries of Eucharistic Minister, Lector, Sacristan, and Acolyte. By extension, we can include altar servers, musicians and other ancillary functions.

In a world of facemasks and social distancing, how can we be faithful to the spirit of our worship and yet remain safe around one another? I wish I had a clear answer to this question. The path of least resistance would be to revert to our pre-Vatican II habits and remain silently in our pews while the priest "says Mass." Doubtless we'll have to curtail some of our practices, but I hope that we'll be able to work out some common-sense compromises that will enable us to move forward. I still want to joyfully celebrate our salvation by supping with the Lord.

During this time of abstinence from Holy Communion, you have made me aware just how important it is to you to receive the Lord into your being. I want for opportunities to receive the Eucharist to be as common as they were before the pandemic. Yet I fear that if the sacred meal is divorced from our gathered community and proclamation of the Word, the richness of the Paschal feast may diminish. The image of Holy Communion as medicine for the soul is valid but it pales in comparison with dining at the Lord's table.

If we have to keep a social distance, and restrict singing and praying in common, we will need to be all the more vigilant about acknowledging each other's presence during liturgy, to listen attentively when God's Word is proclaimed and soak in the richness of the music performed for us. Above all, I want everyone to recognize that this is temporary.



Overcoming Racism: Pope Francis and the U.S. Bishops called out the brutal killing of George
