Our Catholic School

Did you attend Catholic school when you were young? If you did, you participated in a subculture that shaped you and how you see the world — hopefully, in a very positive way. This Catholic formation has been celebrated in plays that run the gamut from Do Patent Leather Shoes Really Reflect Up? to Doubt.

Catholic schools are known for their academic standards, but schooling is more than the acquisition of knowledge. Religious teaching is integrated into the Catholic school curriculum that cannot be obtained in other settings. The quality in Catholic education that stands out most to me is the molding of boys and girls into well-rounded Christian men and women. Ideally, this formation activates Gospel teachings into a habit of being. Graduates of Catholic schools should be so steeped in Christ's message that they mostly go about

Christian living without having to think about it.

Let it be known that all these qualities are alive and well at the School of the Madeleine. As a testament to our academic standing, Catholic high schools actively recruit our eighth-graders. The students regularly participate in the worship life of the school and parish, and they engage in apostolic work for the larger community. Finally, there is an *esprit de corps* among our student body that comes from a renewed sense of discipline. It can be said without exaggeration that this academic year has been the most challenging in our school's existence.
