

Notes from Fr. Nick

SAINT CYRIL OF JERUSALEM





This Thursday, March 18th, is the feast day of Saint Cyril of Jerusalem. Saint Cyril was a distinguished theologian and the Bishop of Jerusalem during the tumultuous fourth century (d. 386). He was exiled twice, but admiration for his charitable work ultimately redeemed him.

Cyril was exiled on one occasion when he preached against the Arians, who were heretics who taught that Christ was *created by* the Father, rather than having always been God. When his detractors couldn't make their charges stick, they accused him of selling Church property to feed the poor — a charge for which he was probably guilty.


Today, Cyril is mainly known for his accounts of Lent and Easter liturgies and his teachings to new Christians. Cyril's descriptions of late fourth-century Holy Week rituals form the basis for present-day rites for

adult Christian initiation. He describes how

new members of the Church were chosen (our Rite of Election), the process of purification (Scrutinies) and the baptismal rituals of the ancient Easter Vigil. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and the reformed Triduum of the Second Vatican Council largely follow Saint Cyril's practices. Yet beyond that, in his *Mystagogical Catecheses*, he expounded on the symbolism of Holy Week, which gives us a deeper understanding of rituals then and now. His writings are so powerful that we still use his texts today.

Pervading Cyril's writings is an emphasis on God's loving and forgiving nature and the healing power of the Holy Spirit. He wrote at a time when many theologians saw God mainly as a stern judge. Cyril's understanding of God's love for human beings governed his own life as well. He accepted being sent into exile with equanimity and forgave his captors.



Many families in Timor-Leste live in rural areas and work as farmers. But climate change has reduced the amount of



food they can grow, and more than one-third of the population does not have reliable access to enough nutritious food, inhibiting children's ability to develop to their full potential.

With training from Catholic Relief Services, families are starting home gardens to grow different vegetables,

beans and other foods that are rich in nutrients like vitamin A and iron. The gardens are built to withstand droughts and flooding, and the families add the food they grow—such as spinach, cabbage, peanuts, carrots and tomatoes—to their daily staple of rice, providing more nourishing meals that help children grow and stay healthy.
