Christ's Passion



A year ago, we celebrated Holy Week differently than ever before in my lifetime. The clergy and a few necessary laypeople were all we could safely accommodate in the church. Although our world hasn't yet returned to normal, at least this year we'll all be able to gather outdoors in the Dominican Garden. Our liturgy committee has done an admirable job of adapting, and I hope that our out-of-the-ordinary liturgies will inspire us in ways 'the usual' might not. Hopefully by this time next year, we'll be experiencing the warm comfort of the worship we've known and loved.

Too often, I think we hear the Passion story with an attitude of 'Look what they did to him so he could save us'. We are closer to the spirit of this Gospel passage when we see the Lord's suffering as the consequence of his preaching. It's hard to believe that a message of the Fatherhood of God and fraternity of humankind could provoke such a ferocious response. But Jesus' message upset a long-standing power structure that fought to resist it. His death on the cross did not, in and of itself, save us. Rather, his death on a cross was the consequence of the grace of God being unleashed on a world where evil will always succumb to God's goodness.

The Passion should be a warning to us that, no matter how benign the message we carry as Christians, there

are consequences for us as well. We may not suffer a shameful death through living out our faith, but at least it should cause us to forego opportunities that, on the surface, look appealing to us. For a young person, it could be choosing to participate in Sunday liturgy rather than soccer tryouts. For adults, it might mean rejecting a lucrative job because it requires a questionable moral stance. This very week, choices we make as part of our faith could be the resolution to participate in the Triduum liturgies rather than relaxing at home... or perhaps taking Good Friday off from work to spend with your family in prayer.

I hope that you will enter into the spirit of Christ's Passion this week. The essence of discipleship is not simply receiving the grace of Jesus' Passion; it is being formed into the identity of Christ and proclaiming His message through our lives. This formation also means accepting the consequences of the Gospel — both in death to ourselves, and in rising to new life.



On Good Friday morning, JESUS, who had been arrested the night before, was judged by Pontius Pilate, the ROMAN governor. Pilate had him WHIPPED. Then to make fun of Him the SOLDIERS made a CROWN of THORNS and put it on His head. They threw a purple cloth on Him and beat Him with RODS, saying, "Hail, KING of the JEWS!" Then Pilate had Jesus brought out in front of the people and asked them what they wanted to do with Him. The people, who had welcomed Him into JERUSALEM a few days before with their HOSANNAS, now shouted that He should be crucified.

So Jesus was made to CARRY a heavy CROSS out of the city and up a big HILL. Because He was so weak from being beaten, a man named SIMON of Cyrene was forced to help Him. The soldiers tore off Jesus' CLOTHES and attached Him to the cross with NAILS through His hands and feet.

Jesus offered His life for our SINS. He hung on the cross for three HOURS until He DIED. Nearby were His mother MARY, JOHN the Apostle, and Mary MAGDALEN. After He died a soldier stuck a SPEAR into His side to be sure He was dead.

Did you know that at every MASS we re-offer Jesus' sacrifice on the cross in an unbloody way on the altar?


