Assumption of Mary



the place of the normal readings we would have for the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Years ago, Fr. Tom Parenti and I visited the shrine near Ephesus in Turkey where tradition has it that Mary lived out her days, cared for by St. John. Mary accompanied John when he left Palestine for the port of Ephesus, and she chose to live on the top of a mountain near that city.

Today, the site of Mary's home is covered in olive trees; a truly serene and beautiful spot. The only ancient remains at the site is an excavation of a large baptismal pool. Perhaps the most impressive thing about the shrine is the number of visitors from all over the world and from many different faiths. We tend to forget that many Moslems venerate Mary.

In 1949, Pope Pius XII proclaimed the doctrine of Mary's Assumption in the document Munificentissimus Deus, which codified traditional Catholic teaching (common to Orthodox and Anglicans) that Mary was assumed body and soul into Heaven. This completes the logic of her Immaculate Conception. If Mary never had the stain of Original Sin at birth, then her death would not be like others'. Therefore, she rose to Heaven as her Son did.

This year the Solemnity of the Assumption falls on Sunday, and so it takes

Because, unlike Mary, we experience sin, our spirit and body are separated at death. The Church teaches that at the end of time our bodies will be reunited with our souls in the full inauguration of the Kingdom. If you're trying to resolve the rational issues of this teaching, remember that this is one of the Mysteries of our relationship with God. This side of death, we'll never fully understand it. It is rather, something to be pondered.


