Notes from Fr. Nick

Back to School



Surprisingly, one of the things I missed most during the pandemic was the sound of our students in the schoolyard. Whether it's in Shanghai or London, Melbourne or Seattle, no matter what language is spoken, children at play sound exactly the same. It's a hopeful sound. I felt a sense of relief — a sense that the ordeal of the epidemic was passing — when, although limited at first, that joyful noise returned to our property.



We're still living under constraints on account of the pandemic, but the fear and depression when school commenced virtually last year has been replaced. The School of the Madeleine really didn't miss a beat. Classes resumed provisionally at the beginning of this year and are now nearly back to the "new normal." Last year's eighth-graders completed their work and moved on to the high schools of their choice.

Our administration, faculty, staff, and volunteers deserve special recognition. Teaching online is a challenge. The lesson plans teachers were comfortable with had to be completely reworked to meet the demands of distance learning. When children returned to the school building, scheduling became a nightmare: initially, classes met on alternate days; they had to be convened and dismissed with social distancing, parents had to pick up students on a staggered schedule, and classrooms were reconfigured to accommodate social distanc-

ing. Yet, somehow, we all got through it. Thanks to all who stayed the course.

The novelty of interacting with one another in person will soon wear off, and we'll settle into a routine that may feel stifling. But for the moment, let's relish the mundaneness of back-to-school, let's enjoy personal contact, let's cherish the sound of youth at play in our schoolyard. If there's a silver lining to the pandemic, it's that what we once took for granted is now seen as a privilege.


