Notes from Fr. Nick

Labor Day

A few years ago it occurred to me that when I wake in the morning, of all the possible things I could do in the day, getting to work is right at the top of my list. Although I have my bad days, I am aware that I actually relish the routine, discipline, challenges, and personal interactions that occupy my work day. I wish I had learned this aspect of my character much earlier — I wouldn't have gone through the day dreading things that actually made me happy!

How do *you* feel about your work? Is it a means to an end? Something to be endured until the weekend? How has the pandemic affected your ideas about work? Were you unemployed, did you work from home, did you have to change how you did your work? For me, everything I learned over more than 40 years of priesthood had to be reassessed. It wasn't so much that I had to work harder, but that I had to do everything differently—it was exhausting!

Many people have to work in jobs that are unfulfilling, or that force them into relationships with people who make their lives

miserable. Some people are inadequately paid, and many work long hours and have difficult commutes. Others work to avoid the chaos and bad feelings at home. Without diminishing these situations, I think countless people are unhappy at work because we live in a culture that promotes leisure above all else. For them, work is a necessary evil. Covid-19 forced us to reconsider this.

On this Labor Day weekend, take a little time with your spouse or your family to consider the value of your work. Ideally, work should be fulfilling in itself. Short of that, it should be at least bearable, and provide the means to accomplish other important things for yourself or your family. If you truly find your work to be unfulfilling, maybe you should consider how you can make it more so: can you change how you interact with your colleagues, customers, or students? Is there something you can do in your workplace that will help? If the troublesome aspects of your job cannot be changed, then it may be time for you to consider a new career.

The Church generally talks about "vocation," rather than work. This is because we believe that God has a special plan for everyone's life. Your work may not be at the center of that plan, but it should at least promote what God wants for you. Pray that your work is in keeping with your purpose in life. Know that if it makes you happy, there is a good chance you are in keeping with God's vocation for you.



Peace & Justice Notes

Immigration Reform - Two House Bills (the American Dream and Promise Act H.R. 6 and the Farm Workforce Modernization Act H.R. 1603) passed nearly six months ago, but now languish in the Senate. *These bills are supported by the U.S. Conference of Bishops,* and would provide legal status with a path to citizenship for Dreamers, Temporary Protected Status holders, and Deferred Enforced Departure recipients (H.R. 6); and create an earned legal status program for undocumented agricultural workers and improve the existing H-2A temporary agricultural program (H.R. 1603). Take action to move these bills through the Senate! Advice on how that be accomplished is available at
