Notes from Fr. Nick



The Ranks of Angels

This week, we will celebrate the feasts of Archangels and Guardian Angels. Have you ever wondered about the various categories of angels? In ascending order, they are: Angels, Archangels, Principalities, Powers, Virtues, Dominions, Thrones, Cherubim, and Seraphim. You'll hear this list in the part of the Eucharistic Prayer called the *Preface*, just before we sing the *Sanctus*.

The origin of this list comes from a medieval theologian called **Pseudo-Dionysius the Aeropagite**. Pseudo-Dionysius, originally from the Middle East, was one of the most influential Churchmen of the Middle Ages and, basically, a fraud. He purported himself to be a companion of Saint Paul, but in fact lived centuries later.

When Pseudo-Dionysius' theology made it to Europe in the 12th century, it had a massive impact. He espoused a theology called Neoplatonism, which merged the Greek philosophy of Plato with Christian theology. For Platonists, reality resides in Heaven, and our material world is an imperfect reflection of heaven.

The first thing Pseudo-Dionysius did was to assemble the various names for angels from Christian scriptures and elsewhere into one list. He then ordered them in a hierarchy. How did he determine the hierarchy? As a Neoplatonist, he looked for what he saw as the most perfect organization on Earth—and what else but the Catholic Church? He therefore organized the angels to mirror the Church's structure. Since the Church was organized in ascending order — from lay-people through deacons, priests, bishops, and the Pope he supposed that it must reflect the perfect order of Angels in Heaven.

There are some major problems with this way of thinking. **Aristotle**, Plato's student, disputed his teacher's idea that perfect reality resides in heaven; he stated that the essence of a thing resides in itself. The world is created by God, and is not simply an imperfect reflection of heaven. Beginning with St. Thomas Aquinas, the Church gradually moved away from Neoplatonism, but it never completely abandoned it.

Unwittingly, we still fall into the neo-platonic trap of believing that the world is bad and heaven is good, which can cause us to discount our worldly experience. Our personal theology becomes one of avoiding sin, rather than sanctifying God's creation by our participation in it. God intends us to love our life and be happy here on earth. We can also be drawn into theological *cul-de-sacs*. The fact is we know almost nothing about angels other than they are messengers from God, and we really know nothing about how Heaven is organized. The danger of deifying the structure of the Church because we believe it mirrors heaven is that it can prevent the Church from adapting to the needs of our time and place.


