




The rich young man in today's Gospel reading was sad because Jesus told him to sell his things and give his money to the poor.

Notes from Fr. Nick

Reverence & Piety

Many of us assume that reverence and piety are synonymous, but in fact piety is a means toward reverence. *Reverence is the awe and respect one expresses in God's presence.* In the past, it was often called "Fear of the Lord" (Proverbs 9:10), one of the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. *Piety*, on the other hand, is the discipline we use to achieve reverence. Therein lies a difficulty for many people.

Some people are naturally reverent. It may not be evident to those around them, but when the Lord calls them, they automatically stop and focus entirely on God's presence. However, even many of the saints were not able to enter this state without years of practice and patience. Like them, most of us must engage in spiritual practices which place us in the right frame of mind to accept the Lord's presence. These practices are the essence of piety.

At its most basic level, piety usually involves quieting ourselves. We may go to a special



place, close our eyes, chant or recite prayers, read the Scriptures, take on a special posture, or whatever else works for us that allows us to hear the voice of the Spirit.

Pious behavior that works for one person might not work for others. It can even be a distraction for them. Sometimes we're disappointed when a friend doesn't want to pray the Rosary or some other kind of prayer. This does not mean that they are not reverent. More than likely, they approach God through some other means.


However, piety can sometimes become hollow. This is when it becomes an end in itself. More than once over the course of my priesthood I have observed people who are 'showing off' their piety to others, and I'm sure I've engaged in this behavior myself. Upon reflection, it became evident to me that I wanted people to think I was reverent, rather than actually being so.

At different times in our lives, piety may take different forms. I find the Rosary deeply gratifying when I'm feeling very sad, or when I'm facing a major problem. However, at other times, I simply find it distracting. At present, a good conversation with my spiritual director seems to help me find God's presence in a way it did not when I was younger.

As with any discipline, we need to keep trying new forms of piety so that we may sustain contact with God. Laxness is unlikely to promote God's presence. We must also recognize that the piety we express as a community may not always satisfy our own needs, but is necessary for the welfare of the rest of the Church. Singing, responding to prayers, liturgical postures (sitting, kneeling, standing) draw us together so that the whole is greater than the sum of its parts.

While piety is not, in itself, reverence, it can lead us there. Pious activities are the doorways to reverence, and there are as many doors as there are human personalities.
