Notes from Fr. Nick

Pelagius



In the fourth and fifth centuries, a theologian challenged the teaching of the Church about Original Sin and good works. Believed to be from Wales or Ireland, Pelagius journeyed to Rome, where he was something of a sensation. He was known for his ascetical nature and lived an extremely simple life, which was reflected in his appearance. Pelagius was also a persuasive speaker. The combination of his extraordinary appearance, oratorical skill and unorthodox theology ultimately led him afoul of the Church, and defined a heresy that vexes us to this day.


Pelagius changed his positions many times, and so it's difficult to pin down some of his specific beliefs. Nevertheless, it is known that he disagreed with St. Augustine and others about the doctrine of Original Sin, which teaches that human nature has fallen from grace and tends toward sinfulness. Human beings, Pelagius said,

are completely responsible for their own actions—good or evil. To his way of thinking, Adam

and Eve merely set a bad example, and Christ is only a good influence. While these points may seem like technicalities, they have enormous consequences for the way Christians live out their faith.

On the one hand, we can claim that we are incapable of living a virtuous life because our situation is unique; we are flawed in such a way that the rest of the world can't relate to our condition, and cannot therefore pass judgment on us. More problematic is the other extreme: human beings can and must work to merit their salvation. This position ignores God's radically free gift of love to us and our utter dependence on God.

Catholics seem to fall into the trap of believing they can work for their salvation—and thus, that God owes it to them—more than that they are un-savable. When misfortune befalls us, we can im-



agine ourselves saying to God, "I try to follow my conscience and lead a good life. Why am I being singled out for such misery?" Or, more arrogantly, "I've said all the prayers and kept the commandments. I demand salvation!"

Although Pelagius apparently lead a simple life, his teaching lacked humility. Like the Pharisee in the Gospel this Sunday, his theology demanded that he be saved because he had followed all the rules. In our own relationship with God, it's easy to unwittingly become Pelagians. When we feel mistreated, or overconfident, it's important to remember that God's love is a completely undeserved gift, and we are completely dependent on it for our salvation.
