
Last Weekend's Jazz Concert & Cuisine!

Notes from Fr. Nick

Thanksgiving



Many years ago, a fellow priest gave me a collection of short stories by a South African author, Nadine Gordimer. All of them were written during the apartheid era in that country. As a white woman, she had a unique perspective on the dynamics of those times.

Gordimer wrote about the exclusion of Blacks and people of color from everyday rights and privileges that we might take for granted. Her stories also made it clear that this legalized repression of most of the country's population dragged down the ruling class as well: talents and skills that could have benefitted the country as a whole went wasted. Blacks, Coloreds, and Whites had to jump through arbitrary and unnecessary hoops in order to associate with each other. Pervading this unreal atmosphere was the unnerving sense that everyone was being watched.

America is certainly not perfect — we have our own sad history of segregation, and many of us may readily identify with the

plight of South Africans during apartheid. While these rights have recently been under attack, at the very least, our legal system is designed to protect our civil liberties.

Our civil liberties are cause for thanksgiving. We can have a lively debate about the way our city, state, and country are run. We can vote or protest or work for change within or outside our government, mostly without fear of retaliation. We can associate with anybody we wish. We often take these and many other rights for granted—and for the most part, they should be. If we had to stop and consider the consequences every time we exercised our basic rights, the free

exchange of ideas — which produces so much of our greatness — would be in jeopardy. Gordimer's stories illustrate how the civil restrictions in South Africa came close to destroying their entire society.


As we give thanks this Thursday, let's be thankful for part of the basic fabric of our culture, civil liberties, which allow us to live and flourish.






