




Notes from Fr. Nick



A priest, a rabbi and a minster walk into a bar . . . anytime we hear an opening like that, we expect to be pleasantly surprised by the end of the story. We may groan at the punchline, but I suspect we're also a bit intrigued about the outcome.

Parishioner Tom Hall recently lent me Antonio Zadra and Robert Stickgold's book, *When Brains Dream*, which is about the neurology of dreaming; in other words, the electrical-chemical activity in our brains as we dream. Most other authors tackle the subject of dreams psychologically, so this was a welcome new slant for me.

Zadra and Stickgold speculate that the rather bizarre nature of our dreams comes from the brain trying out "loose associations" we might not entertain during our waking lives. For example, we would consider driving a motorcycle while playing a violin as dangerous and ridiculous. Yet, our brains regularly create loose associations like this. Every so often, these associations are fruitful, and inventions on the magnitude of the electric motor are conceived. Somebody else connects the focus of their eyeglasses with oxidizing silver, and the camera is invented. (Both these inventions apparently came in a flash of inspiration, rather than research). Dreams may be the root of creativity.




So, what do these insights have to do with humor? Maybe nothing, but I propose that humor works in our waking lives the way dreams work as we sleep. Humor also tests loose associations. When there is a match, we get a pleasant little bolt of energy and we laugh or chuckle in appreciation. It relieves stress, and can send us into a sort of ecstasy that often changes our perspectives on dilemmas we cannot resolve otherwise.

In this way, humor and dreams are a portal into the mind of God. If our dreams and humor are in the image and likeness of God, then we can speculate that the universe is the result of playful creativity rather than some random evolutionary determinism. This helps us appreciate science and nature. We don't see our lives as just a cruel twist of fate, but as part of a vast cosmic playful creative process and that puts things in perspective.

The end of Psalm 65 may say it best: "The meadows are covered with flocks, the valleys are decked with wheat, yes, they sing!
